



Hughes said the present crime wave in Eastern Canada was not attributable to returned soldiers. A great many of the present day disturbers of the peace, he said, were young men. At present there were 400 young men under 20 years of age in the penitentiaries of Canada. He attributed this partly to the lack of proper home training, and partly to the evil influence of the moving pictures. In answer to another question he said he was not in favor of administering the lash. He also hoped the day would come when hanging would be abolished.

Give Control a Trial. Montreal, April 18 .- The report of the Social Service Committee to the Anglican Synod contains a recommendation that the people support the government's action in taking over control of the liquor traffic. It voices the opinion that the government is doing what it thinks best, and that under the circumstances it is up to every citizen to give the new system a fair trial.
