MARRIED FIFTY-TWO WOMEN

General Hughes Relates Story of a Man in the "Pen."

The Ottawa Citizen of Friday has the following: Brig-General William, St. Pierre Hughes, D.S.O., superintendent of penitentiaries in Canada, delivered an instructive address on "The Evolution of Our Penitentiary System," before a small, but appreciative audience in St. Andrew's Presbyterian church last evening. The meeting was presided over by the pastor, Rev. G. D. Kilpatrick. The keynote of the address was that the last few years had seen a wonderful change in the conditions obtaining in the penitentiaries. A real effort was being made to reform the inmates along sane and sensible lines. They were being afforded every opportunity to educate and fit themselves for carrying on various occupations after they had obtained their freedom. Each institution had been fitted up with clean, bright and airy work shops, where many trades were being taught by qualified instructors. The speaker paid high tribute to the Salvation Army, which, he said, was the only organization which was making a real effort to be of service to the inmates after their release from the penitentiaries. He thought other organizations should devote themselves to this work, as practically every prisoner needed some form of assistance or guidance when released. General Hughes related a story of one man in Kingston who had married 52 women. On one occasion he was sentenced to two years for marrying seven women, and four months for stealing a horse and cart. The classification of the inmates included doctors, lawyers, and preachers. At present there are four preachers in the Portsmouth Penitentiary. In answer to a question, General Hughes said the present crime wave in Eastern Canada was not attributable to returned soldiers. A great many of the present day disturbers of the peace, he said, were young men. At present there were 400 young men under 20 years of age in the penitentiaries of Canada. He attributed this partly to the lack of proper home training, and partly to the evil influence of the moving pictures. In answer to another question he said he was not in favor of administering the lash. He also hoped the day would come when hanging would be abolished.

Will Celebrate Second Battle of Ypres on April 22nd.

Announcement was made today by Lieut.-Col. R. H. Webb, D.S.O., M.C., that there will be a reunion dinner of the "Originals" of 1914 in the Windsor Hotel, April 22nd, to commemorate the second battle of Ypres fought six years ago on that date. Ex-officers and officers will gather here from all parts between Halifax and London, Ont., for the occasion. Final arrangements were made at a meeting here last night when Brig.-Gen. C. Armstrong, C.B., C.M.G., acted as chairman and Colonel Webb as secretary. It was announced that General Sir Arthur Currie, G.C.M.G., K.C.B., etc., had gladly consented to act as chairman at the dinner and that the following officers were pleased to become president and vice-president: Lieut.-Col. C. B. Price, D.S.O., D.C.M. (14th Bn.) and Captain W. M. Taylor, M.C., C.P.A.

Shannonville M.D. Spilled as Result of Bad Dazed on Side Road.

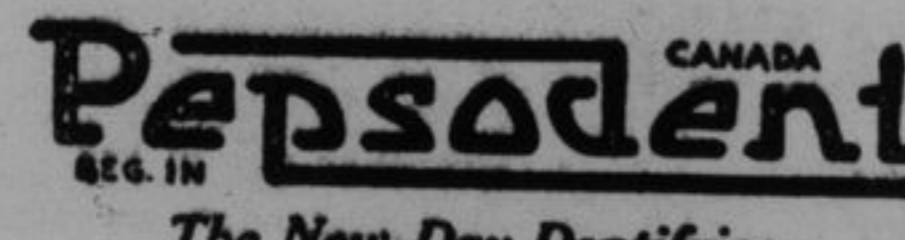

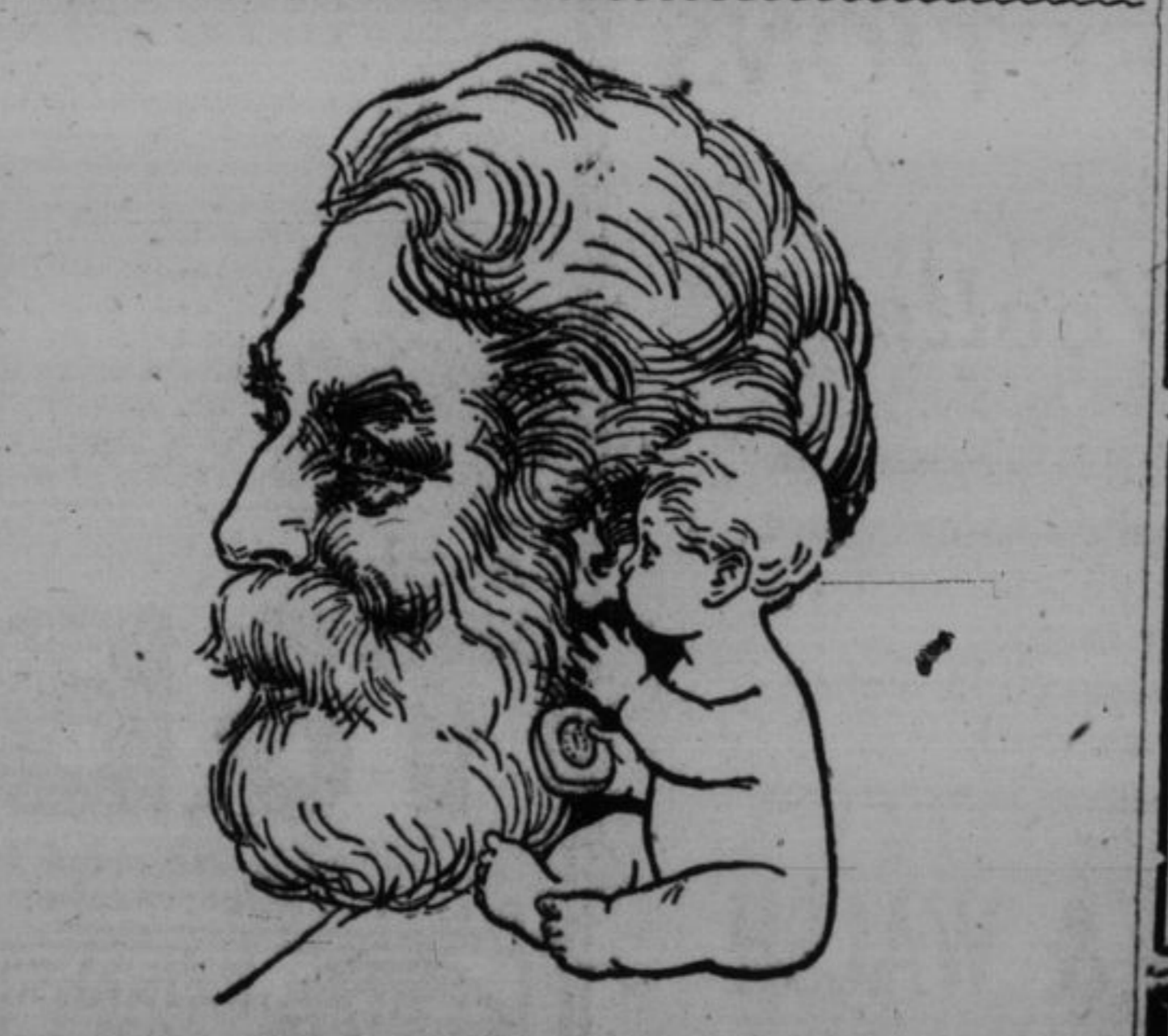
