# In the World of Sport

## Ottawa Now Favors Seven-Man Hockey

The outcome of the recent world's hockey series between Ottawa and Vancouver and the fact that each team was able to register a victory under the rules of its opponents has given rise to the annual talk of a set of uniform regulations and the usual debate as to which of the two sets is superior.

Officers and players of the Ottawa hockey club were quoted extensively in the British Columbia papers as saying that they were most favorably impressed by seven-man hockey, and it was intimated that the Ottawa club would make an effort to have the National Hockey League revert to the former system.

What they did say was this: "That the seven-man game as now played by the Coast team, that is, with three men on the defence, and three on the line, was productive of faster hockey than the six-man style, wherein the teams kept three men back and only two on the line."

Six-man hockey, as introduced in the world's series, plus the longer forward pass area in mid-ice, and the pass out from the goal, was a failure, but when they got back to six-man hockey under the clean-cut rules of the N.H.L. it was decidedly good.

The consensus of opinion in the Ottawa camp is that seven-man hockey with the extra man back is really the best in the long run, but they would eliminate the pass out from goal-keeper and cut "no man's land" down to about forty feet. However, members of the Ottawa team are unanimous that the change could not be practicable in Ottawa or Montreal unless larger ice space was secured. It might go all right at Hamilton or Toronto.

The playing rules will be thoroughly discussed when the National Hockey League meets again and it is almost certain that the eastern circuit will revert to the former penalty system and banish to the bench without substitutions all who break the rules in the matter of foul play.

Frank Patrick told the writer that there was not a chance of the Coast League ever changing to six-man hockey, so it is evident, after the success of the 1921 series, that the mixed regulations will continue. Patrick states that he will eliminate the playing designation "rover" next season and call him instead "centre defence" player.

Pro. hockey will likely be organized from Montreal to Vancouver within a comparatively short time. Winnipeg is ready to make the plunge, and in Alberta they are fed up on the deception which has been practised for the past two years in the "Big Four."

## JERSEY CITY GETS BOUT

To Hold Dempsey-Carpentier Fight Close to Marion.

The world's championship heavyweight fight between Jack Dempsey and Georges Carpentier will take place in Jersey City, close to Marion Station, across the river from New York.

The place selected by Tex Rickard, fight promoter for the great fistie battle on July 2, is less than fifteen minutes from Broadway by subway tube.

The choice ends nationwide speculation on the subject, and confirms the opinion of those who predicted that the fight would be within a few minutes' ride of New York.

A contract was closed today between Tex Rickard and John P. Boyle, owner of the property, leasing a 30-acre tract for the site of the international battle. Mr. Rickard led it be known that he had leased the ground for the sole purpose of staging the fight.

He plans a seating capacity of at least fifty thousand, and it is predicted that with prices running from \$5 to \$50 per seat, the gate receipts may touch the million dollar mark.

The fighters will battle on a percentage basis, 36 per cent to Dempsey as the present world champion, and 24 per cent to Carpentier, the champion of Europe. This will enable each to draw down a substantial sum and leave something for the promoter.
