A CLAYTON CAPTAIN DIES

Capt. Jasper Ellis Passes Away—Recall Wreck on Erie.

The funeral of Capt. Jasper Ellis, well-known resident of Clayton, N. Y., who died in an Ogdensburg hospital, Sunday, aged 72 years, was held Wednesday under the direction of the Masonic lodge of which Clayton Ellis had been a member for twenty-seven years.

Captain Ellis was born September 17th, 1848, the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Amos Ellis. A peculiar fact in connection with his death is the fact that his father was drowned in the wreck of the sailing vessel, Manchester below Fairport, O., on Lake Erie, on the afternoon of Easter Sunday, April 23rd, 1859.

The Manchester left Clayton March 28th, 1859, being the last of thirty sailing vessels to leave port after being tied up for the winter. Among other Clayton men on board besides Capt. Ellis' father was Capt. W. H. Vincent. The Manchester sailed to Detroit and took on board a carload of lumber. Coming back she ran into a terrific gale, became waterlogged and began to sink. The crew started to take to the boats, but in some manner Mr. Ellis, who was cook on the Manchester, was washed overboard and drowned. His body was found two days later lodged in a tree and it was buried at Unionville, O., seven miles back of the old Madison dock.

The mate of the vessel also lost his life and the body was never recovered. The rest of the crew made shore after a hard fight against the wind, coupled with the cold weather and a blinding snow storm. The captain and another member of the crew went insane, so terrible was their suffering.

Capt. Ellis was about eleven years old at the time of his father's death. He was undaunted and with the blood of a sailor in his veins, he followed the boats practically all his life. Most of his sailing was confined to the St. Lawrence. For many years he was engineer on the Midge, one of the smallest boats on the river. She was a side-wheeler and commanded by Capt. John Johnston. The Midge operated about fifty years ago, in the days where there was no railroad here, and it was necessary to have daily boat communication between this village and Cape Vincent.

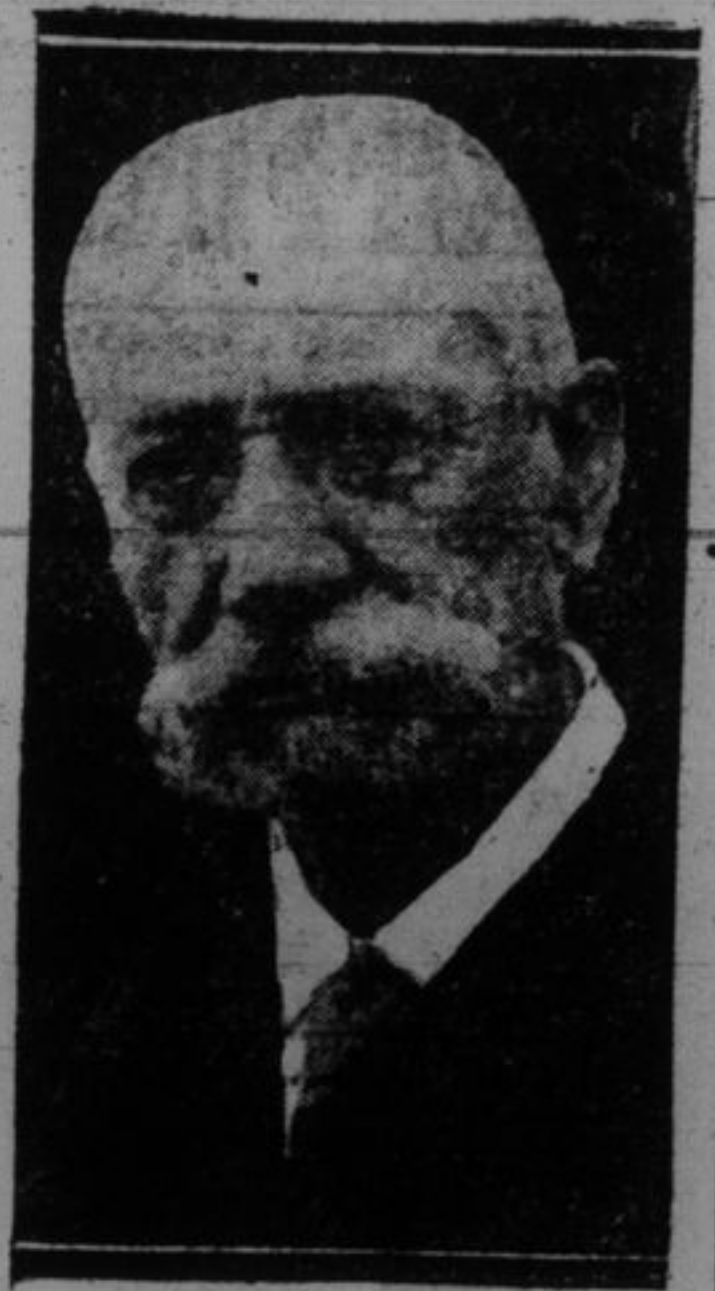
Besides the Midge, Capt. Ellis also sailed on other vessels, some of which he commanded. Most all of his experience was confined to the pleasure craft. At the time he went to the hospital he owned the Columbia, formerly the old Van Horn.

Montreal, April 29.—An extensive plan of action has already been prepared by those interested in the new-

ly-formed Christian Women's League against indecent fashions, which already has a membership of approximately 10,000 women in this province. The organization is designed not only to cover the province of Quebec, but to extend all over the country where women willing to join

are to be found. The League is open to both Protestants and Catholics alike, and pamphlets explaining its aims and ambitions are being distributed throughout the Dominion, and to Roman Catholic priests, who are asked to bring the League to the notice of their congregations.
