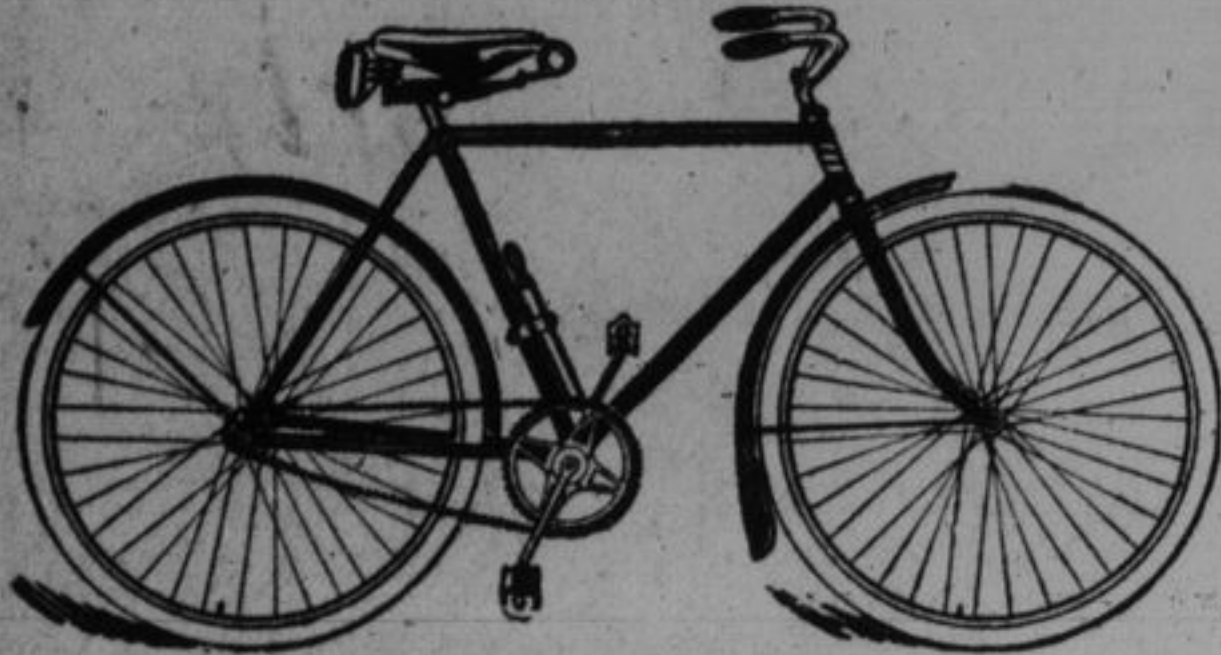

In the World of Sport

O.R.F.U. LOOKS FOR MANY NEW ENTRIES

Senior Clubs Are Expected in Hamilton And Kingston Next Fall.

The Toronto World says: No sooner had the announcement been made that the twelve-man game would prevail in all the Canadian rugby unions this coming fall than the O.R.F.U. began to commence to reap the benefits from the untiring work that the officers have done in the past. While the playing season stopped with the defeat of the Torontos by the Argonauts in the semi-final for the Canadian senior championship in November, the officers and executive have been doing a lot of missionary work, with the result that the indications point to a great season for the big organization this fall.

In recent years the O.R.F.U. senior series has been looked upon by certain parties as more of a city league, with Toronto teams furnishing the competition, but this year things will be different, and the O.R.F.U. will boast of a four-club senior circuit, including Torontos and Parkdale, last year's entries, and new teams in Hamilton and probably Kingston. By placing a team in the latter place the O.R.F.U. is entering a district that is fraught with great possibilities, and even if the competition offered by the teams from the eastern part of the province this coming fall is not as high in calibre as the opposition it will meet from this end, there is no doubt that in 1922 and following years the Ontario union will profit to a large extent.

With the exception of the intercollegiate teams in Kingston and the Ottawa Big Four and city league teams, there has not been a single rugby club between Toronto and the Quebec boundary. This condition is unexplainable to many of the old-timers, as the famous Kingston and Peterboro teams of years ago made reputations that seemed ample enough to keep these places striving to live up to the records of the teams representing the cities in past years. With a senior club in Kingston it will not be difficult to build up two or three strong intermediate groups along the shore of Lake Ontario and the St. Lawrence, and much correspondence has already passed between leading sportsmen in these places and the O.R.F.U. officials.

New Rules Help O.R.F.U. Without doubt the twelve man-a-side game will help the O.R.F.U. more than it will any other rugby union, with the possibility of various provincial unions throughout western Canada, where the style was introduced last fall with great success.

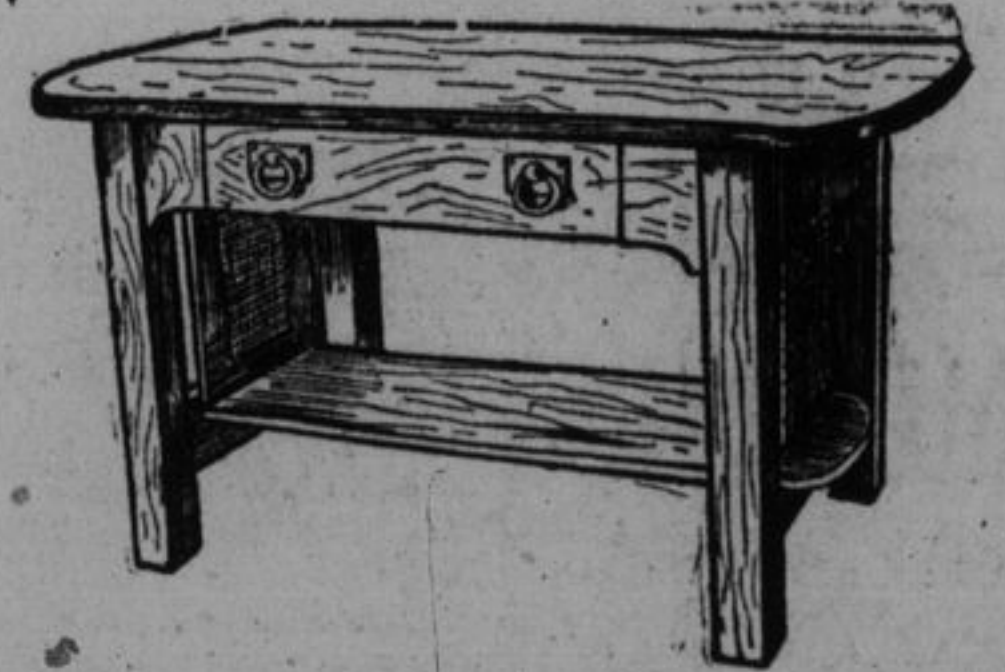
