

Must Not Wear Uniform

Strong protest is being made by the military authorities against persons in their civil occupations wearing articles of uniform without authority, and steps have been taken to put a stop to this practice, which is contrary to the statutes. Indeed, only last year the Criminal Code was amended to cover this matter, and Chapter 43, section 10, reads as

"Any person who without lawful authority wears any uniform of His Majesty's Naval, Land or Air forces, or any uniform which is so similar to the uniform of the said forces as to be likely to be mistaken therefor, shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$300 or to imprisonment to a term not exceeding twelve months or to both fine and imprisonment."

Manitoba House Discusses Ministers'

Winnipeg, May 5 .- By finally passing the supply bill, authorizing current expenditure of 12,662,778, putting fifteen bills through the final stages, giving second reading to numerous other bills and making good progress with consideration of the supplementary estimates, totalling \$607,402, the legislature got through a considerable amount of work today. With such expedition was business despatched that the opinion was confidently expressed by members at the close of the night session that things would be in fine shape for prorogation Thursday evening.

An item in the supplementary estimates providing for increasing the salaries of cabinet ministers from \$5,000 to \$6,000 was discussed and the item for \$1,000 increase in the premier's salary was passed. It was decided to make a test vote of this item when the house went in concurrence on the supplementary estimates, the decision, for or against, to apply to all the items raising ministers' salaries.
