It was the Romans who bequeathed to the world the task of solving the problem of government, not for cities and small units, but for whole nations. > judicial functions. The Dominion Government. In legislative matters the Federal Parliament consists of a House of Commons, a Senate and a representative of the King, known as the Governor-General. Each Province in the Dominion elects a certain number of members to the House of Commons, based on a fixed representation of 65 members for the Province of Quebec. The members of the Senate are appointed nominally by the Governor-General, but really by the Government in power. Elections for the she'll kill you. members of the House of Commons take place at least once every five years, but the Senators are appointed for life. The Governor-General is the He clothes his thoughts in grandest representative of the King in Canada. He acts towards the Canadian Parliament as a Council, composed of the Cabinet, advises him. The Provincial Governments are formed on the same plan, except that the Provinces of British Columbia, Alberta, heart, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Ontario, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island have a single chamber, while Nova Scotia and Quebec have two chambers. New Brunswick was formerly bicameral, but an Act abolishing the Upper Chamber came into force in 1892. Prince Edward Island has a compromise, having fifteen Assemblymen and fifteen Councillors, the
