

INSPECTION OF ARTILLERY INCIDENTS OF THE DAY

On Barricade Common by Racy Local News and Items of General Public Interest.

Lieut.-Gen. Sir Henry Burstall, C.B., K.C.M.G., D.S.O., militia general headquarters, Ottawa, inspected the R.C.H.A. and the heavy battery on Barricade common Friday morning.

The movements, which consisted of drill movement and column of route, were all carried out in perfect order showing the high degree of efficiency attained under Lt.-Col. W. H. P. Elkins and his staff of war-seasoned officers.

Col. A. T. Ogilvie, G.S.O., commanding the R.C.A., accompanied Gen. Burstall, who will remain in the city over Sunday to take part in the church parade and the unveiling of the R.C.H.A. memorial in the city park on Sunday morning when the district headquarters staff will be present, also representatives from all other units.

Dr. Bruce Hopkins has been made a member of the executive committee of the Canadian Association for the Prevention of Tuberculosis.

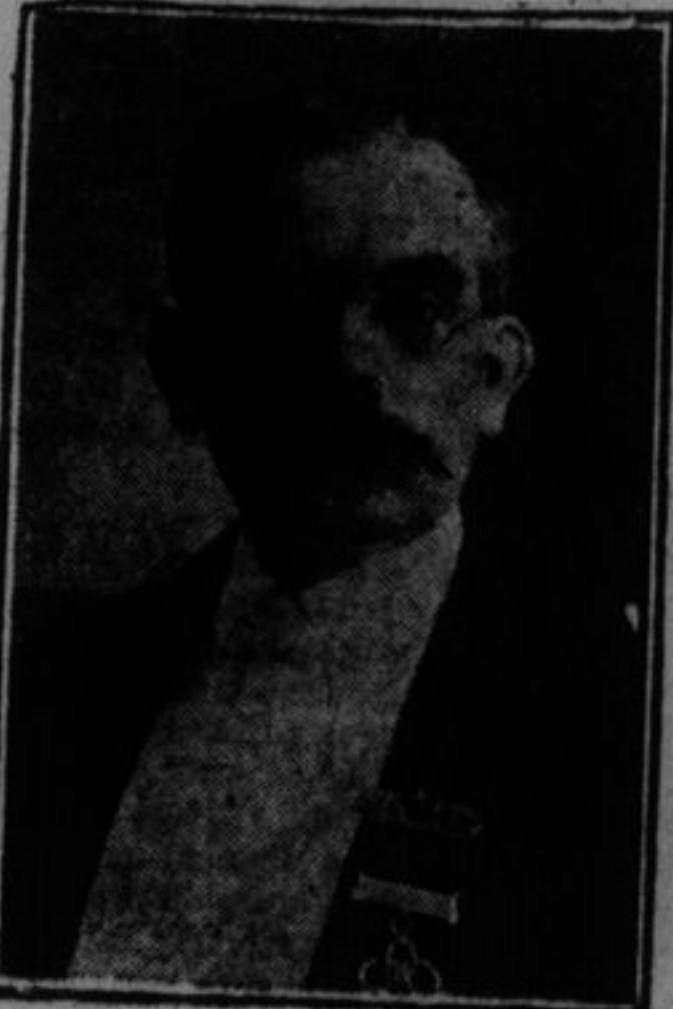

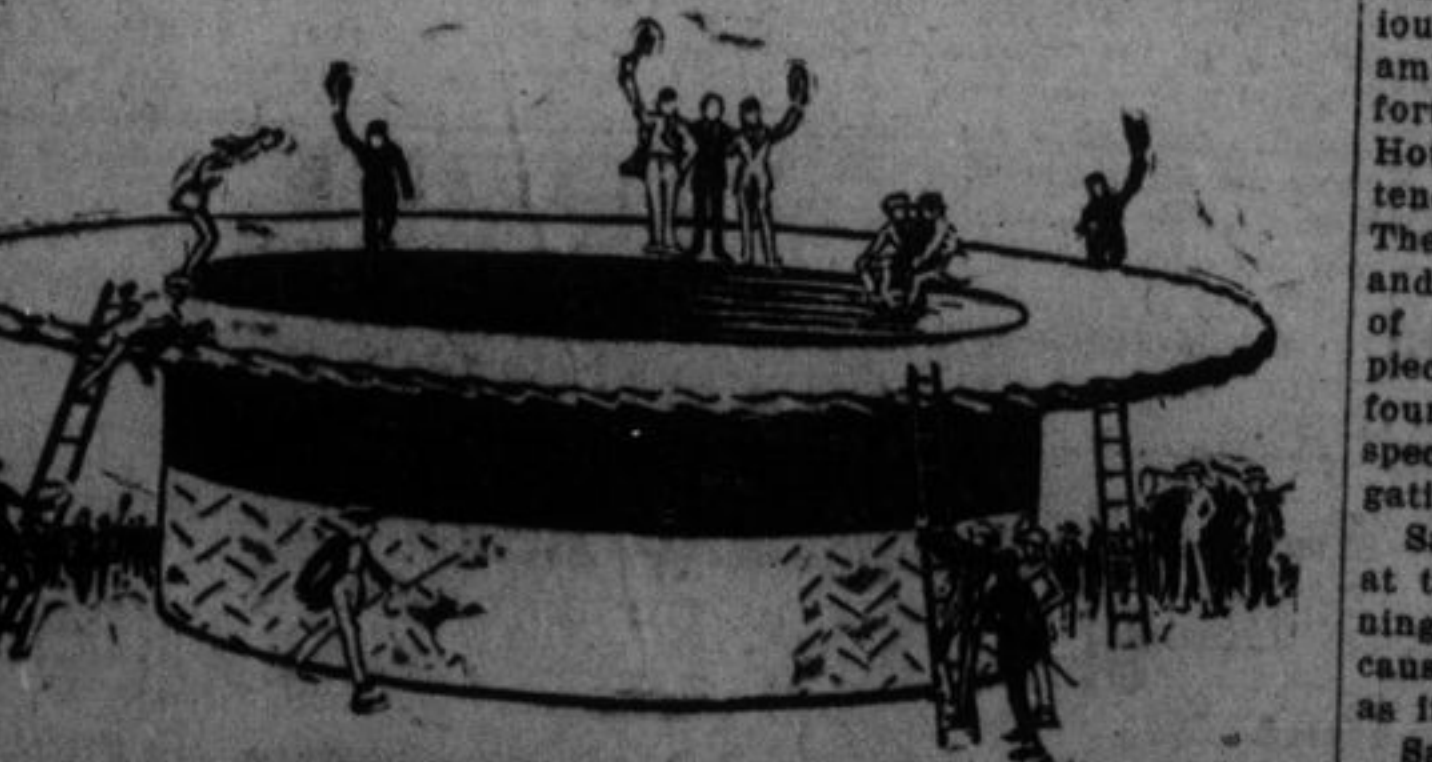

RAN CAR INTO A STORE, IS SERIOUSLY INJURED

Frederick Sawyer Lost Control—Removed to the Hotel Dieu.

Frederick Sawyer, of the Army and Navy Veterans canteen, was seriously injured when he ran his car, an Overland, right into Marshall's hardware store at the corner of Princess and Montreal streets at 5 p.m., Thursday, and is in the Hotel Dieu hospital. He was driving along Montreal street to Princess street and in some way he became confused or lost control, and the car plunged into the shop window. He sustained severe cuts about the arms and head and was otherwise seriously injured. R. J. Reid's motor ambulance was called and the unfortunate man was removed to the Hotel Dieu hospital where he was attended by Drs. Huxek and Howard. The car was considerably damaged, and the plate glass front window of the store was shattered into pieces. Two bottles of liquor were found in the car and the license inspector, W. McCammon, is investigating the matter.

Sawyer was delirious upon arrival at the hospital and blood was running from his ear a symptom that caused the doctors much uneasiness as it might mean a fracture. Sawyer is a returned soldier, having served in France during the war. He was wounded and suffered from shell-shock.

Wrong Crest on Stuart Tablet in St. George's

When Sir Campbell Stuart, London, England, visited St. George's cathedral on Thursday afternoon and viewed the tablet erected in memory of his great-grandfather, the late Rev. Dr. John Stuart, he found that the wrong Stuart crest had been engraved upon it and that a name in the inscription was wrong. He asked that the tablet be replaced, and this will be done.
