Montreal, May 20 .--- As the result of a dinner given by Mark Workman, which was attended by a large number of Jewish citizens at the Windsor hotel, to inaugurate the financial campaign for Montreal's contribution to the Palestine Reparation Fund. over \$100,000 was subscribed within half an hour after the opening of the list and encouragement given for the belief that no trouble would be experienced in reaching the objective of the campaign, viz., \$400,000.


