Why Dilation of Stomach Calls for Diet Regulation.

Normally the human stomach has a capacity of four or five pints. Under certain conditions this organ dilates so enormously as to have a capacity of 30 or 40 pints. There is one case on record where it reached

Anything, then, that results in impaired health, wasting of the tissues of the body and general lack of tone may be followed by stretching of the stomach walls.

Chronic inflammation of the lining of the stomach predisposes to this unpleasant condition. Such inflammation is usually the result of overeating or of overdrinking. Beer drinking has been a fruitful cause for dilatation of the stomach.

There are cases of acute dilatation, the result of a single indulgence in an enormous meal. It is much more common, however, to find the dilatation a gradual process, due to repeated overeating.

Other Causes.

There are other causes where disease has obstructed the passage from the stomach into the intestine. As the growth or disease has progressed the opening has grown smaller and smaller. Naturally, the contents of the stomach have been dammed up,




