

Sheriff Allowed Poker Games and Took Inmates on

Albany, N.Y., May 25 .- Testimony that Sheriff John Selley, Jr., of Reasselaer county had paid a discharged prisoner \$50 in settlement of a poker debt incurred while the prisoner was an inmate of the county jail, that prisoners had accompanied him on trips to Philadelphia and Syracuse. and that he had given orders that the police should not be notified of the escape of two prisoners from the institution, featured the opening of a hearing before a committee of the state commission of prisoners in connection with allegations of lax management on the part of Sheriff

Undersheriff George T. Morris told the committee that when Herbert Craig, a prisoner, was released on March 19th, he was given a check for \$50 by the sheriff. When the witness asked Deputy Sheriff Henry Kaillen the reason for the payment, the reply was:
