BRITISH GOVERNMENT BLESSING TO INDIA

Internecine Strife Transformed Into Well-Governed, Peaceful Commonwaith.

Chicago, May 26 .- The British administration has been a great blessing to the masses of India, Rustom Rustomjee, former editor of the Orintal Review, Bombay, India, told members of the Association of Commerce at a luncehon today. He declared he was not a "servile apologist" of the British government of India, but belonged to the constitutional opposition faction until that party was captured by radicals.

In explaining the government India Act of Great Britain, by which an almost autonomous government being formed composed of nativ leaders, the speaker said:
"To have found a continent as big

as Europe without Russia, three times as populous as the U S., torn by constant internecine strife, without peace or settled government, and then to have transformed it within three generations into a well-govern-ed, peaceful, prosperous, democratic commonwealth of Indian nations, is an achievement without a parallel in the history of mankind," he said.

London, May 26 .- It is officially stated that between August 4th, 1914, and January 1st, 1920, 159 fully trained nurses and 141 Voluntary Aid Detachment nursing members died while on service with imperial units. The details of the total of 300 are as follows:
