**Verona Defeated Lakeviews, 14 to 9; Famous Plumbers Beaten At Last**

**Two Games At Cricket Field Last Night—County Game Two Hours—Movies Tounce the Plumbers, 9 to 4, in Mercantile League Fixture.**

In a two-hour session which lasted the full eighteen rounds, Verona defeated Lakeviews in the County League fixture, piling up a 9-run lead in the second innings and keeping fairly well ahead throughout the game as a result. Fifteen men faced Saunders in the first of the second, and of these, nine crossed the plate and seven picked out good hits. Saunders went up completely in that round and his support went with him. From then on he steadied considerably and in the last three innings not a mark was put up against him.

Williams threw masterly ball for the visitors but his turn came also, in the last of the second when Lakeviews touched him for four hits and four runners crossed the plate. Like Saunders, he too steadied toward the end of the game.

In general play the Verona team undoubtedly had the better of the argument. A few errors were chalked up against them but their playing was much more steady than that of the Kingston team. Williams gave them confidence and they gave him support. B. Craig was a little off color in left field but accounted for a two-bagger, a single and two runs at the plate and partially redeemed himself.

"Bill" Beswick was a great help for Lakeviews and it was greatly through his efforts that they steadied down and started to play ball. He played the game at all times, batting a fielding with equal excellence.

Lakeviews are gradually rounding into shape. They have received a few setbacks but will give a good account of themselves before the schedule is very far run. Had it not been for Williams' pitching last evening they would have taken down even the nine run lead which Verona held over them.

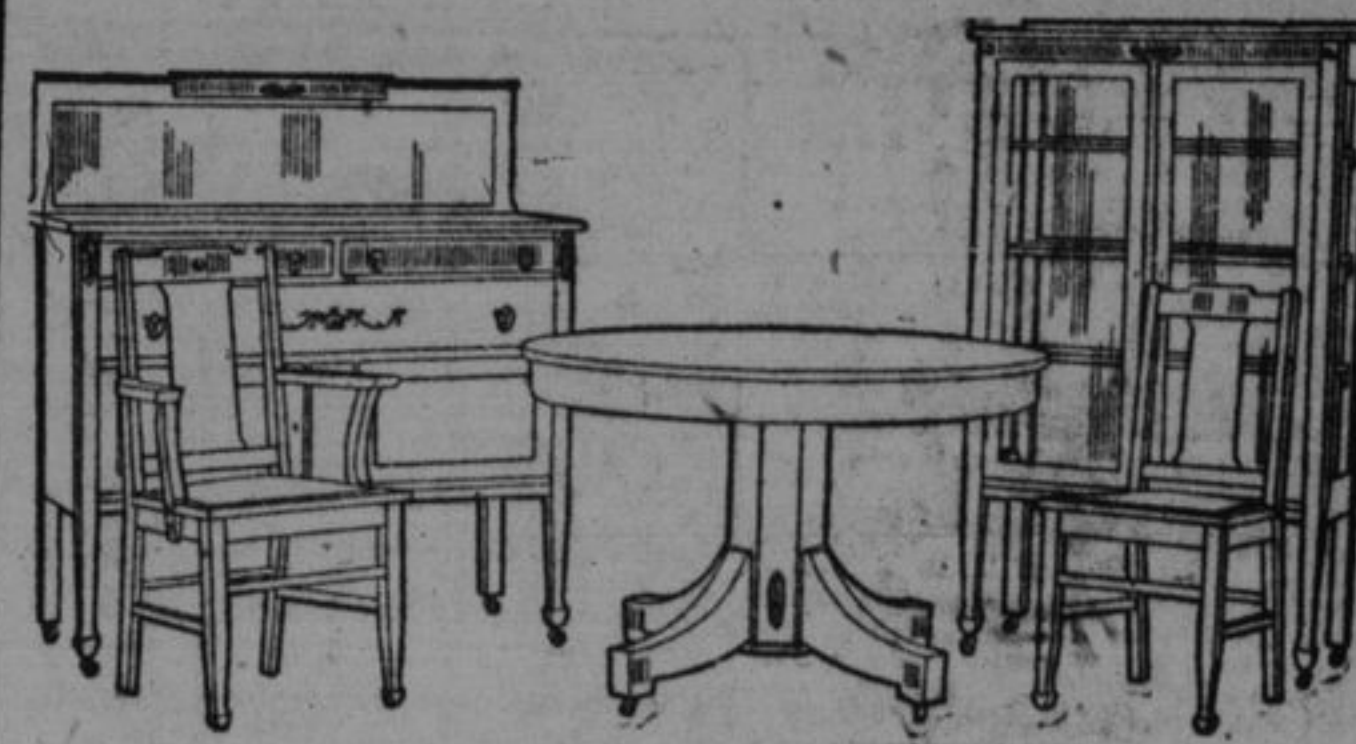
