Macdonald Park Improvements Visitors to Macdonald park have noted the improvements that have been made this year to the beach in front of the George Richardson memorial bathing house. Last year sand was dumped along the shore to cover the rough stone, but this spring it was found that the action of the waves had washed it some distance down the shore. Another attempt is now being made to give a smooth bottom by paving it with sandbags filled with gravel, sand, and coment. The bags are being placed as closely as possible and the crevices filled in with cement. This will give a smooth surface and will be just as good as flat rock. The work will be continued for a distance of some thirty feet from the shore. A cement step has also been constructed at the water's edge, thus making landing ery easy.
