### GLORIOUS EVEN IN DEFEAT

Carpentier Was Game—Broke His Thumb and Sprained His Wrist.

It developed after Carpentier had returned to his training camp at Manhattan, N.Y., that during his aggressive and effective attack in the second round, the Frenchman had broken his right thumb and sprained his wrist. Carpentier was unable to explain how the injury had occurred, but it is thought that it came as a result of a hard swing which landed high on Dempsey's head.

What effect, if any, this injury to the European challenger's most effective hand had on the ultimate outcome of the battle it is impossible to state. Carpentier was almost entirely on the defensive in the third and fourth rounds, although he did not noticeably avoid using his right hand and arm in blocking or striking out when the opportunity arose.

Regardless of just which blow caused the vanquishing of Carpentier, the Frenchman gave a remarkable exhibition of skill and gameness against a heavier, more punishing opponent.

The broken bone in Georges' right hand was set to-day and he said it felt much better, although it was still swollen and inflamed. Georges said he was very tired and that he would rest for four or five days. He read several newspaper accounts of the contest and expressed delight at the favorable comment on his part of it.

#### Glorious in Defeat.

"I feel glorious even in defeat," he smiled, "to think that I did what I wanted to do—show them that I was game."

"We would like to get a match with Bill Brennan or Tom Gibbons," Descamps said. "The doctor says that Georges' hand will be all right with careful nursing. Georges will keep in condition and will be ready if challenged."

"Georges suffered an injury to his hand two weeks ago while boxing with Joe Jeanette, and it may have been this that caused it to snap yesterday. After the work-out with Jeanette that day he told us he had hurt his hand, but asked us to keep it quiet. He said if the newspaper men learned of it people would say he was preparing an excuse. It was for this reason that he started secret training."

Carpentier, through his comrades, told his story this afternoon. He had been instructed to let Dempsey force the battle, but just before the opening bell he said:

"The American people have been told that I was a game and courageous boxer. Watch me."

When he came to his corner after the first round he told them that every one of Dempsey's blows had hurt.

"When keep away from him," he said they told him.

"Never. I must box with every ounce of power within me," he replied.

#### Too Big and Powerful.

During the second round Carpentier said he hit Dempsey with three right hooks and three right uppercuts, and that all his power was behind them.

"When he didn't go down under those blows I knew I could not defeat him," the Frenchman said. "It was then a matter of going on and boxing, trusting to luck to escape his hardest punches."

"When I went at him in the third I left the pain in my right hand and somehow I could not use it accurately or with power. I got it in several times, but I could tell that it had little effect. Then Dempsey's right hand caught me in the back of the neck just at the crest of the spinal column."

"My body was numb all over, and I thought I was gone, but managed to last the round."

"I felt a little fresher when the bell rang for the fourth, but at the outset Dempsey got to my body and the numb feeling returned, so that I did not feel the blow that beat me. It gripped my teeth and managed to arise, but the next blow finished the bout."

"Dempsey boxed cleanly and acted like a gentleman all the time. It was an honor to have met him, and I don't think it is a disgrace for any man to be defeated by him. He's a great boxer, and it is my prediction that he will be champion for many years to come."

After the knockout Trainer Gus Wilson said Dempsey came to the challenger's corner, shook Georges' hand and said:

"You're a game fellow, Georges, and we'll be friends always."

"You bet, Jack, always," the Frenchman answered.
