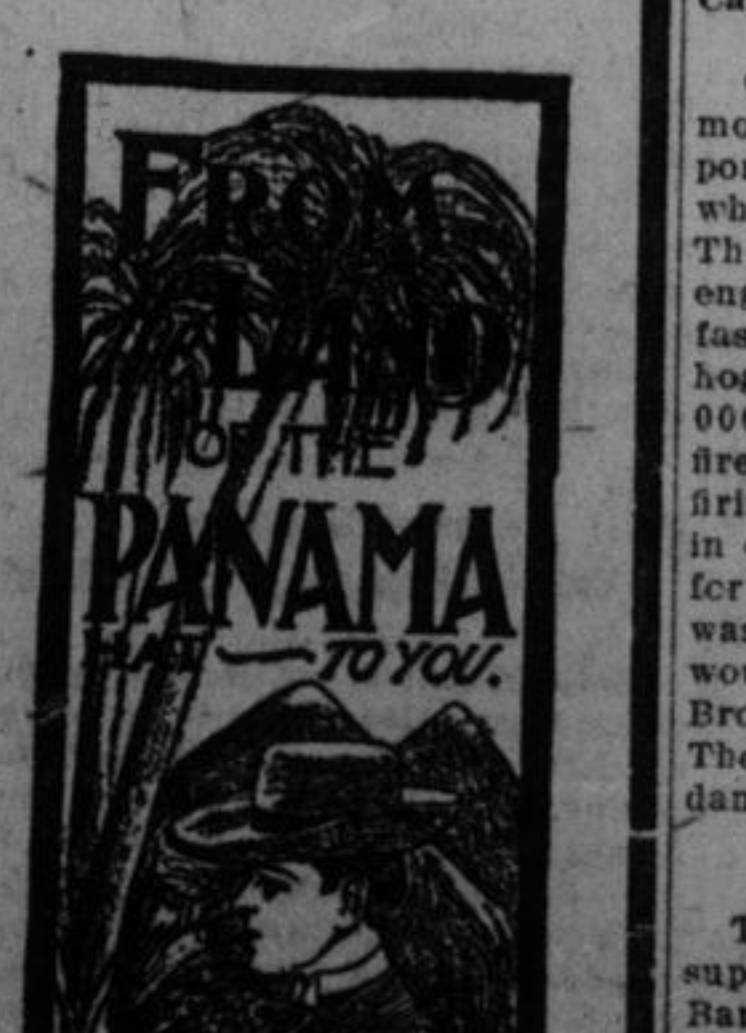
Charles W. Livingston returned to Toronto yesterday after spending a week with Mrs. Livingston at Collin's Bay.
