

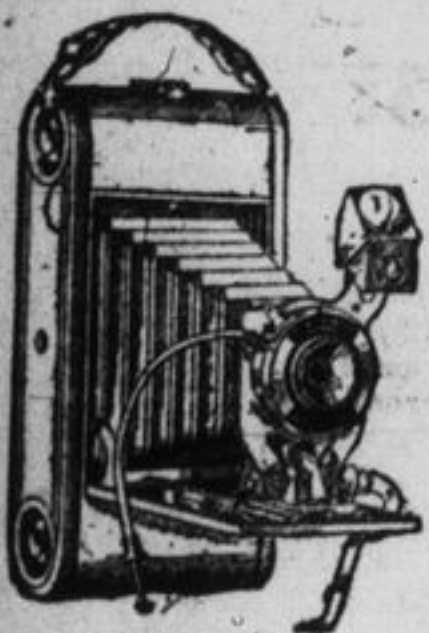

GREAT TENNIS GAMES BOOKED FOR AUGUST

Tennis will reach its greatest heights in history during an August and September campaign. Perhaps the biggest feature of the season will be the National Women's championship, to be played at Forest Hills starting August 15th. Miss Suzanne Lenglen, the great French girl, holder of the world's title, will visit America for the first time and go after new laurels. In the role of American defender, Mrs. May Sutton Bundy, regarded as one of the greatest women players of all time, will return to the courts. Mrs. Bundy, according to reports received from the coast by Julian S. Myrick, president of the United States Lawn Tennis association, is playing in old-time form, which means much to those who want to see the American title remain at home. The French government has provided the funds to send the French Davis cup team to America, even if it loses its preliminary round to India. William T. Tilden, world's singles champion, who is back home after a European invasion, predicts that the France-Indian match will be one of the greatest of the preliminary rounds. Canada and Australia are to play at Toronto July 23rd, 24th and 25th. The winner of the match will play the British Isles team, which defeated Spain in the first round. This match will be played in Pittsburgh. Argentina defaulted to Denmark, and the Danes will have their first play in the third round at Cleveland, meeting the winner of the Pittsburgh matches. The Philippine team defaulted to Japan, and Belgium defeated Czechoslovakia. The Japan-Belgium match is scheduled for Minneapolis, but it is thought that Belgium will default through the lack of funds to make the trip here. If India beats the French team, both will come to this country, as both have made all the arrangements. The challenge round, in which the American team will defend the cup, is to be played Sept. 2nd, 3rd and 5th, at Forest Hills. Stands to accommodate 14,000 are planned. More than \$25,000 worth of season tickets have already been sold. Tilden, who has just finished winning the British and French championships, probably will rest during the early season. He has been in training since May, 1920, and in that time has made two trips to Europe and one to Australia. He looks rather drawn and tired.

UNBET BLIND HORSE WINNER AT BERLIN

A heavily played race, where not a single bet was placed on the winning horse, was an unprecedented feature of the Berlin Grand Prix meet Monday in Berlin. A blind horse, which his owner lacked confidence to back, galloped away from a field of eleven. The next rankest outsider took second with equal ease. The Grand Prix also went to an outsider, Oskan, while King Midas, which earlier was rated unquestionably the best German three-year-old and whose absence in the German Derby deprived that race of much significance, finished last. The crowd was enormous, and the money bet through the pari-mutuels constituted a record. Almost ten million marks were placed through the betting machines at the track and probably half as much again through handbooks in town beforehand.

CARPENTER GOES TO FRANCE.

Will Return in Month to Start Training for Gibbons Bout. Georges Carpentier has left New York on La Savoie for his home in Paris. The defeated champion was accompanied by Franes Deschamps, his manager, and Charles Ledoux, the bantamweight champion of Europe. Carpentier plans to return in a month to start training for a bout on Columbus Day for which he has been signed by Tex Rickard. His opponent probably will be Tommy Gibbons. The Frenchman has not given up his Manhasset training farm, and will do his work there when he returns. Quia Wilson, his trainer, and Captain Thierry Mallet, his friend, will live at the farm during his absence. Carpentier said before leaving that he was glad to be on his way to see his wife and baby daughter, but that he would be just as glad to come back, as he has nothing but pleasant recollections of America.

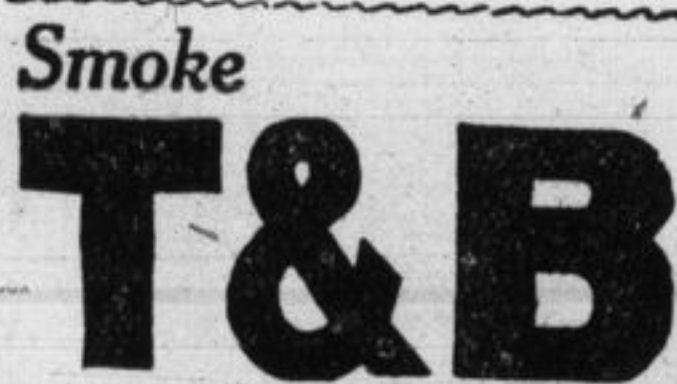
