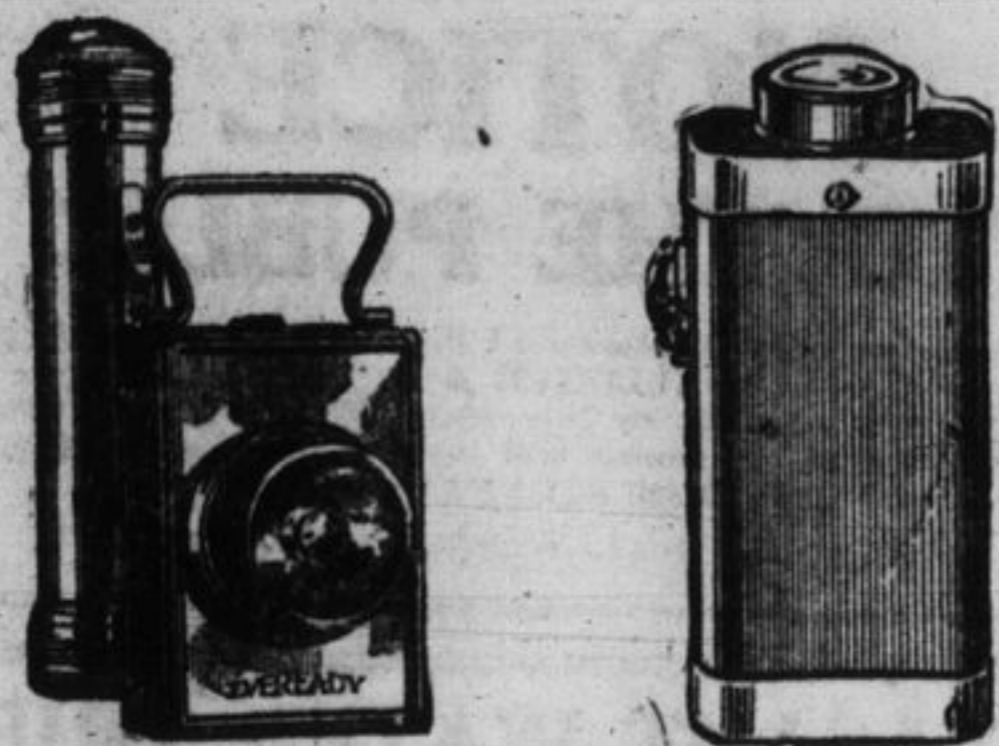

THE BICKLE BELT GIVEN TO O.A.C.

Trustees Place Featherweight Trophy in Hands of the Boxing Commission.

DR—THE BICKLE BELT
The belt which John Bickle presented for the 122-pound boxing championship of Canada has been turned over by the trustees, Major W. J. Morrison and Lou E. Marsh, to the Ontario Athletic Committee.

The following letter explains the reason why the trophy is transferred to the control of the body which is so ably administering boxing affairs in the province:

Langstaff, Ont., July 14, 1921.
Gentlemen: In the interests of the sport of boxing, I believe your commission should take over and administer, under such rules and regulations as may be formulated and promulgated, all trophies of a national or international character appertaining to the province. There are certain trophies, such as the Bickle sport belt, which have been allowed to become dormant for want of co-ordination in different branches of the sport.

If this were followed up you may discover many trophies in other lines of sport, and through your administration public spirited citizens should and would no doubt donate further trophies.

In furtherance of the above idea, we, the trustees of the Bickle belt, presented by J. P. Bickle for competition among professional featherweight boxers and to be emblematic of the Canadian championship, both wish, if your commission will undertake the custody and trusteeship of the belt, to relinquish our trusteeship of the belt to your commission, who are so splendidly elevating the sport to that plane of clean, manly endeavor to which it belongs.

PADDOCK IS FASTEST RUNNER IN WORLD

The following sporting editorial is from the New York Globe:

The report that Charlie Paddock a week ago equalled his 9 3-5-second record for the 100-yard dash and incidentally ran a 220-yard dash in 21 1-5 seconds—almost a second below his best—will leave certain track enthusiasts in gloom. They had hoped for 9 2-5 or even 9 1-5 seconds for the hundred, and 20 at for the two hundred-twenty. To them Paddock is the chance of a century—the human Man o'War that should leave his highest mark while he may.

They forget a number of things, these observers—chief among them the fact that Paddock the sprinter is an inheritor as well as a performer. It is a fact that if we have learned a lot about brass and steel machinery in the last fifty years we have learned much of human machinery, too. Athletics is more of a science than it was. The relation of one part of the body to another, the use of food, the adjustment of exercise to certain physical results, the utilization of weight and momentum—all are better understood today than when B. J. Watters, Sr., and Arthur Duffey ran. Paddock is unquestionably the fastest man in the history of the world, but others might have been as fast with his advantages. Similarly the pole vaulters, high jumpers, broad jumpers, and hurdlers of today have received gifts from the past. Could Earl Thompson have beaten Kranzlein if the latter had had all that Thompson received from other hurdlers? When one man runs the 120-yard sticks in less than 15, it is not long before dozens have done it in 15 flat.

Paddock's legs are wonderful things, but they are not a tireless his own legs; and, just as he is profited by a long American experience in sprinting, he will pass on to a few feet-footed youth something of his skill. He cannot give speed, but he can give a certain amount of method. A little is enough to clip off a fifth of a second. There will be more Paddock's, and one better than the Paddock who recently ran what was supposed to be his last race. In 1940, if not in 1922, the record-lovers will see the hundred yards done in 9 2-5, and our Charlie Paddock will not perform the miracle.

Has Gone to Defeat.

R. G. Wray, Belleville, received an unkind cut at the Peterboro bowling tournament when he was beaten by McCullough, Cobourg, in the semi-finals for the Stratton Cup, and by Brown, Port Hope, in the semi-finals for the Gillespie Cup. In six years "Bob" Wray's rink has been invincible. Two trimmings after six years without a defeat was indeed a disconcerting set-back, but Wray took the defeat in a sportsman-like way.

Eastern Ontario Lawn Bowlers.
Rinks from the Brockville and Ontario hospital lawn bowling clubs will compete against the touring British bowlers at Ottawa on August 6th. The Prescott club are sending two rinks.

SPORTING NOTES.

In spite of the fact that Tex Rickard, world's greatest boxing promoter, put in a bid of \$150,000 for the Lew Tendler-Benny Leonard bout, Herman Taylor of Philadelphia finally clinched the match for August 13th. Leonard has agreed to make 125 pounds at 2 o'clock and will receive 40 per cent. of the gross receipts. The baseball park where the contest is to be staged has a seating capacity of 35,000 people and the top price will be \$10.

Pete Herman, former world's bantam-weight champion, wants his crown back. Herman, with his manager, Sammy Goldman, is scheduled to leave England for New York tomorrow. After seeing him knock out "Jimmy" Wilde and Higgins, British boxing fans feel that he will be successful if he gets another match with Lynch.

Boxing in St. Louis is to be revived Monday when a flat card of four bouts will be staged under the auspices of the St. Louis Athletic Association. Harry Bandy of the St. Louis and Freddie Jacks, English featherweights, who beat Dick Loadman here the other night, will provide the feature attraction.

Miss Clara Knusenberger, of Seattle, holds the woman's record for the running high jump—4 feet, 10 inches.

Jack Powers, House Hutton, Bill Fagan, Jack Shea and others of the famous old Capitals are strong for the new game.

The Cornwall team is a cracker and will take a lot of beating in their series. If they should go against a Western Ontario team in the finals it would not be surprising if they won, as they have all the elements of a good lacrosse team. Ottawa have a smart team, too, though they do not look quite as good as the Colts.

A Second Ranji?

The cricket captain of Cambridge University is congratulating himself on possessing a player who may rival Ranjitsinhji. His name is Saravanamuttha—his friends call him "Sarra"—and although only twenty-one years of age he has astonished critics with his style and big scores.

Two years ago he scored over two thousand runs in one season of public school cricket in Ceylon. Possessing a marvellous eye, wrists of rare suppleness and strength, and a graceful style, "Sarra" may make cricket history at Cambridge.
