For use of clothing manufacturers an electric awl has been invented that can penetrate 100 thicknesses of cloth at once to make holes in accordance with a pattern.

One of France's most noted aviators has built a passenger carrying plane with two decks, the upper for twelve first-class passengers and the lower for sixteen second-class.

The present annual consumption of oil and oil products throughout the world is estimated at 79,300,000 tons, of which the United States uses about 40,000,000 tons.

A motor for transporting municipal prisoners can carry 60 persons at a time.

The floor of a Paris theatre is reversible, one side being used for dancing and the other holding the seats.

An inventor has patented a grip to be slipped over the end of a pneumatic hammer to aid an operator in guiding it.

Aluminum is being considered by Japanese hydro-electric plants to replace copper on their heavy transmission lines.

Anchor chains, heretofore made from wrought iron by hand, can be cast in their entirety from steel by a new process.

One French railroad is converting 200 of its locomotives into oil burners and another will experiment with that fuel.

An indoor golf game that has been invented includes a push mat for a tee and a target like pocket to catch the balls.

An acetylene generator that requires attention only once a month has been invented in Europe for illuminating road signs.

Cuff links that cover the buttonholes and are joined around the edges of cuffs have been patented by a Rhode Island inventor.

By adding 6 per cent of molybdenum an Englishman has produced what is claimed to be the hardest tool steel yet invented.

Apparatus has been invented to determine the alcoholic content of beverages by volume in a few minutes almost automatically.

The cork from hundreds of thousands of discarded life preservers in England is being removed to be manufactured into linoleum.

An electric implement for retouching photographic negatives enables a user to do more than twice as much work as with hand tools.

French manufacturers of course textiles are experimenting with the African alfalfa grass, which has a fibre similar to jute and hemp.

Ink dried in stick form is used in connection with a pen that a New York man has invented, being made ready for use by dipping in water.

A variety of sugar cane that is raised in China for chewing in the raw state is kept in good condition for months by burial in the ground.

An inventor has patented a mirror and electric light, mounted on the end of a rod, to be inserted into a body to examine its interior.

An Australian is the inventor of a grain harvester that both reaps and threshes and with which a man can cut and sack fifteen acres of wheat a day.

To make it more noticeable a new railroad crossing danger signal is illuminated intermittently by automatic mechanism operated by acetylene gas.

Of Cuban invention is a sugar bowl with four radiating arms, from which its contents are obtained by pressing buttons without lifting the device.

The manufacture of leather from fish skins has been made commercially possible by the invention by a New York man of a process for preparing the leather.
