#### MOTHER TIED HER CHILD TO THE TRACK

Farmer Rescued the Little Girl Shortly Before Train Rushed By.

Quebec, July 27.—The shocking treatment of a child by its mother at Ste. Anne de la Pocatiere was related here in a special despatch from that town to L'Action Catholique. The despatch did not give any names, but likened the case to that of the Gagnon woman of Lotbiniere, who is now serving a life term in Portsmouth penitentiary for having caused the death of her step-daughter, Aurora.

It appears that the woman recently took a violent dislike to her twelve-year-old daughter, and, after inflicting cruel punishment upon the child, finally dragged her to the railway tracks of the Intercolonial line and bound her to the rails leaving her to her fate. The screams and sobs of the child attracted the attention of a farmer working in a field nearby, and he rescued her from her perilous position a few minutes before the train passed by. When the townfolks learned of the action they reported the matter to the authorities, who investigated the case and found that the woman had displayed evidence of insanity of late, and in consequence of her violent treatment of her child, had her interned in an asylum.

#### PRICE TREND DOWNWARD.

Sixty-One Recessions Recorded This Week. Toronto, July 27.—Although various commodities continue to display considerable resistance to the downward course of prices, the general trend toward a lower level remains well defined, there being sixty-one recessions this week in the comparative list of wholesale quotations compiled by Dun's Review, as compared thirty-six advances. Last week out of a total of eighty-three changes, forty-four were declines, while a comparison for the corresponding week last year shows 44 reductions and 39 increases.

Japan Buys Canadian Cattle. Brockville, July 27.—Two animals of the world-famous Avondale farm herd of Holstein-Friesians, owned by A. C. Hardy, and possessing the blood of May Echo Sylvia, the world's record cow, have been purchased for the Japanese experimental farms by Masao So of Tokio, who visited the farm a few days ago. The animals are Sir Champion Sylvia Pontiac, born April 3rd, 1920, and Echo Sylvia Cornelia, born February 6th, 1919.

Oppose Standard Act. Belleville, July 27.—The local cheese board by a small majority went on record as opposing the Dairy Standard act, which imposes payment for milk on the basis of butter fat. The matter of test was discussed at considerable length, and difficulties in the way of accurate testing were pointed out. In taking this stand the local board fell in line with the sentiment of the Picton cheese board.
