Tidings From Places Far and Near Are Briefly Recounted.

Mayor Church laid the corner stone on the New Lisle Stock Arena, Toronto, Wednesday. Cheese sales: Woodstock, 1,359 loaded; 20-3-4-6 bid, no sales; St. Pachel, Que., 700 at 20 13-16c; Montreal, 2,126 at 21 3-4 to 22 1-2c.

Earnings of the Grand Trunk railway for the third period of July show the largest decrease so far this month. The falling-off amounted to \$497,419, or 20.8 per cent.

Justice Idington has not yet signed an order-in-council, with regard to the appeal for clemency for Roy Hetrum and William McFadden, Toronto men, under sentence of death.

Circassian bandits appeared Wednesday in Karabagh, on the Sea of Marmora, thirty-five miles east of Gallipoli, raiding the town, and killed the Turkish governor and commander of the general armies.

Norman T. Hillary has been appointed Ontario supervisor of branches for the Royal Bank of Canada, in succession to Stuart Strathy, who retired from the service of the bank on July 15th, after forty-four years' service in banking.

A communication from Tokio, believed to contain the formal acceptance by Japan of President Harding's invitation to participate in the international discussion of the Far Eastern question reached the state department Wednesday.

Judge Hugo Friend informed the state attorneys at Chicago that he would direct the jury to return a verdict of not guilty in the case of Buck Weaver and Harry Folsch, former White Sox players, and Carl Zork of St. Louis, unless further evidence was introduced against these men.

Russian Land Forts. Berlin, July 27.—The German mines sweeping fleet, which has been operating in Kolabight on the Northern Russian coast, is reported in a despatch from Varde, Norway, to have been fired on by Russian land forts. The German fleet returned the fire, but no damage is reported on either side.
