

He was evidently the large, gracsence; so that later he was mistaken for Jupiter by the heathen. Saul was an undersized Jew, of insignificant appearance. But the exigencies of travel and danger and work bring the real leader to the fore; and we soon find Saul the head of the party. Up to Crprus it had been "Barnabas and Saul"; thereafter it was "Paul and Barnabas." Saul got a new name (still a common practice in the East) at Paphos in Cyprus. Paul means "Little," but the designation was won because he proved himself big

by soul-measurement. A Jewish sorcerer named Elymas had the Roman proconsul, Sergius Paulus, in his toils. There is a whole library of literature dealing with the aptitude of renegade Jews for witchcraft. This man Elymas played for high stakes; he was a daring fellow, of the sort whom most reformers would prefer to deal with in the safety of their own pulpits or editorial sanctums. 
