OSWEGO YACHT TO ENTER 1922 RACES

Being Built by Captain Ben Barr Lewis—Huskie to Have New Sails.

When the Silas L. George cup race is sailed next August at Hamilton, Ont., there will be another club competing for the trophy, Captain Ben Barr Lewis of the Oswego Yacht Club having decided to build a Class R sailing yacht and enter the contest.

For several months Captain Lewis, who is an enthusiastic yachtsman, has been accumulating selected materials for the construction of his craft and this week the stick that is to provide the spar arrived from lower Canada and is being dressed down. The boat will be started as soon as winter sets in and will be ready for fitting out next spring.

The Oswego Yacht Club has not been represented in the George Cup or the Leitch Yacht Racing Association races in several years, but interest in sailing is being revived and the building of a George cup challenger it is believed will do more than anything else to rejuvenate the sport.

Captain Edward S. Lansing of the Crescent Yacht Club, skipper of the Huskie II, which challenged for the cup this year, said today that he was perfectly satisfied with the performances of his boat and would use her as the challenger in behalf of the Crescent Yacht Club again next year. He was not satisfied with the spar and sails, the latter of which were bent on but two days before the races and fitted her badly. A new suit of sails will be procured for next year, and also there will be a new spar in this craft. With the new dress the Huskie is believed to be the most formidable contestant there will be for the George cup unless the new Oswego boat develops some surprising qualities.

Possessed of a good eye and a strong pair of arms or shoulders, it is no great feat for an ordinary batter to hit one out of the park, especially in these days of the lively ball.

The majority of home runs result from a crack at a good ball in the groove. Ruth, however, seldom gets a swing at a good ball. He has to get hold of the bad ones, and therein lies his greatness.

If the situation calls for a sacrifice, Kelly has to lay one down. If a long fly is needed, he has to deliver. Except in cases where he is first up on where there are two down and none on, he seldom gets a chance to take a good wing at the ball.

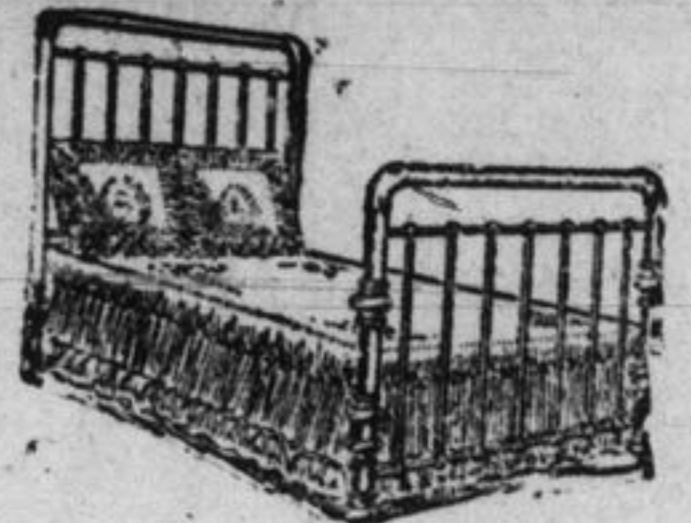

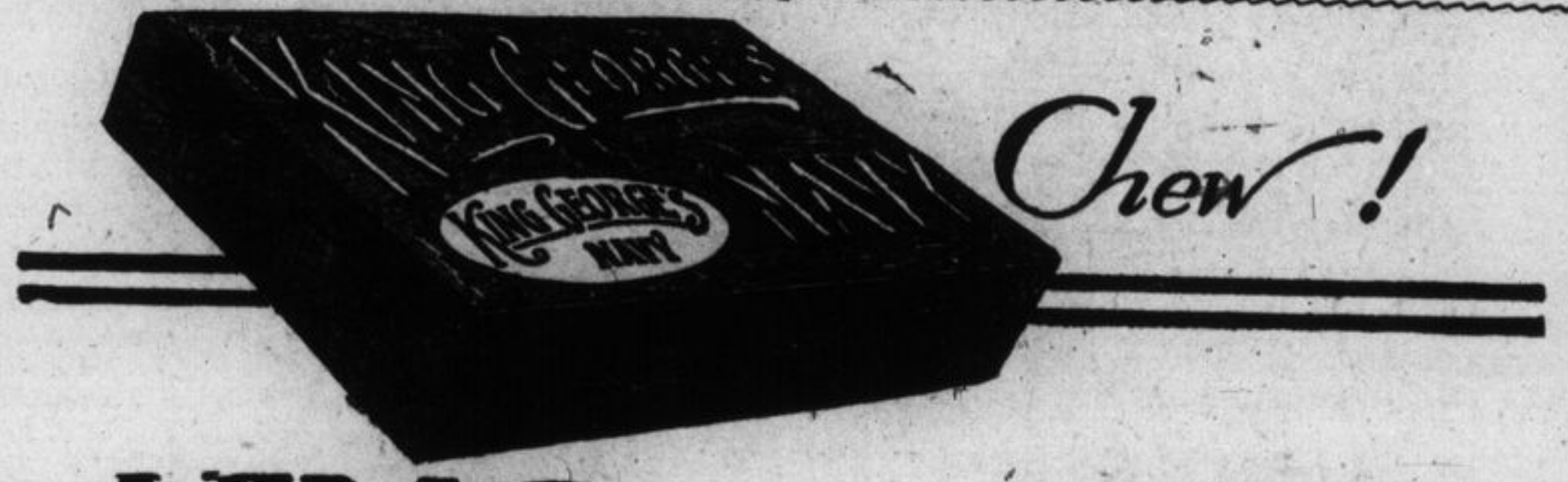
