TO TAKE PLACE BEFORE THE YEAR CLOSES

There Is To Be No Autumn Session of Parliament And No Redistribution Bill---The Issue Before the People Will Be the Tariff--This Question Must Be Settled By the Electors, Declares Premier Meighen.

London, Ont., Sept 2 .- The Right Hon. Arthur Meighen, prime minister, will recommend an early dissolution of the Canadian House of Commons and a general election before the new year.

This was his message to the people of London and to the people of Canada, delivered before an audience of some three thousand people in the Grand opera house last night.

The announcement, which had been awaited with anxiety by all sections of the dominion, came as a surprise to all but a few of the prime premier announced that he considered it the proper thing to recommend an early dissolution and a general election, applause rang through the theatre.
