TO JAIL FOR NINE MONTHS For Stealing a Pair of Binoculars Nearly Three Years Ago.

An aftermath of the disappearance of a pair of binoculars belonging to James McGuire, Union street, was heard in the police court on Friday morning, when John Gallagher, a well-known young man around the city, was sentenced to nine months in jail for the theft of the glasses. In October, 1918, Mr. McGuire was out in his car and attended a party at a home on University Avenue. He left his car in front of the house. A week later, when he had occasion to use some tools for his car, he found that they were missing, also a pair of binoculars. He reported the matter to the police, but time passed and the owner said good-bye to the glasses, but on Saturday afternoon last, on going into a local shop, he was given a great surprise, for there he found his missing binoculars. They had been brought to the shop to undergo repairs. The police were notified, and later it was found that John Gallagher had sold the glasses to a Kingston man for \$5. This man had taken the glasses to the shop for repairs. The plaintiff identified the glasses as his property, and said that before inspecting them in the store, he had given the shopkeeper a description. The citizen who paid Gallagher \$5 for the glasses gave evidence, this witness said that Gallagher had told him that he had bought the glasses from a man who was sailing on a boat. The accused gave evidence and admitted selling the glasses to the citizen for \$5 about three years ago. He said he bought them from a man at the foot of Princess street and paid the man \$3. The police records were produced and they showed that in October, 1918, Mr. McGuire had reported the theft of the glasses and other articles from his car. Constable James Cotter received the report of the theft, and made entry. Constable Cotter was called and gave evidence to this effect. J. L. Whiting conducted the prosecution and Ambrose Shea appeared for the accused.
