

## WANT TO EXTEND MAIN TO THE PENITENTIARY

In Order to Give Work to Unemployed—Utilities to Urge Matter.

A letter from Warden Ponsford of Portsmouth penitentiary was read at Monday afternoon's meeting of the Utilities Commission stating that he was not recommending that the proposed water main from the city be extended to the prison. The reason was not stated by the warden. It had been hoped by the commission that the penitentiary department would accept its offer to extend the city, main to the penitentiary, as this extension would furnish work for the unemployed. Mayor Nickle pointed out that the minister of labor, Senator Robertson, had stated that the government was prepared to help municipal construction schemes for the unemployed, and he was sure that there could be no reasonable objection to the water extension to the Portsmouth penitentiary. The commission could furnish water cheaper than the penitentlary could pump it. A sub-committee was appointed to interview Warden Ponsford and the matter will also be taken up at Ottawa through the Kingston mem-

ber, Sir Henry Drayton. There was a discussion with regard to the starting of the gas main in Division street, which is to be paved next spring. Mayor Nickle wanted the work held off till later in the year when there would be more need of work for the unemployed. Commissioner R. N. F. McFarlane questioned the wisdom of doing this, as the cost of doing trench work in winter would be greater than in other seasons and the commission was elected to spend the money of the people as economically as possible. The mayor said that it was really a charity job, but the workers would be earning and not given ough of the powder and water to doles, as would have to be done if cover the hairy surface. This should work was not provided. These were be left on the skin about 2 minutes, hard times and the coming winter would be still harder. Commissioner McFarlane stated that the price of gas would never be reduced if gas mains were put down in winter when the cost would be one-third more than in normal weather. It was finally agreed that the chairman and the manager should arrange for the doing of the work, which would start on or about the first of November. This would enable the work to be completed before the close of the

Mayor Nickle stated that after the Division street main was completed the Board of Works would start a sewer in Drayton avenue in order to give work to the unemployed during the winter.

Manager Folger was given permission to permit the use of hydrants for supplying water to people in want. As an instance, it was pointed out that the wells of Portsmouth are dry and it would be a kindly act to help out our neighbors, who would have to cart the water from the hydrant nearest the village.

Vienna, Sept. 20 .- A great demonstration and parade were held under Pan-German auspices in protest against "the ignominous peace and its resultant evils." Immediate union with Germany was demanded.

The demonstration was inspired by the Burgenland situation which has not been relieved and continues to cause the gravest apprehension of an internal political crisis. No word has reached the public here on the entente's plan of settlement, but reports from Czecho-Slovakia and Jugoslavia suggest plans of joint military action with Italy under sanction of the entente.

#### Cost Americans More To Keep Army in Germany

Paris, Sept. 20 .- Statistics showing costs of maintaining the various allied armies of occupation in the Rhineland from the beginning of the armistice to May 1st, 1921, have been made public by the reparations committee. Figures computed by government show the maintenance cost of the United States forces of occupation to be \$278,067,010; those of France 230,485,470 French francs; England, 52,881,298 pounds sterling; Belgium, 378,731,390 Belgian francs, and Italy 15,207,717 French francs.

The maintenance cost per day for each soldier of the American occupation forces is placed at \$4.50; France, 15.25 French francs; England 15 shillings; Belgium, 16.50 Belgian francs, and Italy, 22 French france.
