### WHAT IS THE TROUBLE

In the Mercantile League? Who Wins? Where Does Cup Go?

The above questions are being asked by a great many baseball fans. The teams who have competed through the year are also asking it. For a long time now there has been no action on the part of the proper authorities and things are at a standstill. The series stands with Movies winners of one group, because of Plumbers' default of two games ordered played by secretary Walters last week, and a three-cornered competition in the other group. Civil Service and Insurance must play two or three games and Retailers may figure in the proceedings later on. Something certainly should be done. Arthur Horwitz, of the Lion Clothing House, came out last spring and offered one of the finest cups ever brought into, or made in Kingston, for the winner of the series. Teams of very much more importance than the Mercantile League ones would be glad to compete for such a trophy. Yet there is a danger that this fine trophy will go unawarded.

The best thing would be to call a meeting of the executive and order the remaining games to be played on set dates. Those teams failing to put in an appearance would lose by default and the series could be narrowed down to the winners of sections. A little determined action of some kind would be appreciated by both fans and players.

Father Time has taken another great athlete away from the fans in the person of A. G. Hill, England's foremost mile runner, who has hung up his shoes. Hill came to this decision after suffering a pulled tendon during a period of training, the climax of which was to be his second effort to lower the mile record held by Norman Taber of America. Hill is over 30 years old.

### UNBEATEN MORVICH IS BEST JUVENILE

Exterminator Best of Season's Cup Horses—Still Sound as Bell of Brass.

From now until the snow flies and the good thoroughbreds depart to winter quarters and the cheaper ones go south in quest of smaller purses racegoers will hear stories of wonderful feats of all descriptions by horses of all ages. Every horse which wins a stake in fast time will be proclaimed as a wonder and many will herald several of them as champions. But they won't be champions. The title of King of the Turf and the juvenile champion already has been bestowed upon the heads of two monarchs. Willis Sharpe Kilmer's grand old cup horse, Exterminator, is unquestionably the best horse of the year. Twenty thousand racegoers said so at Saratoga and ten times that many agreed with those who were present at his coronation.

There are probably a dozen horses which can beat him at a mile, and there might be one or two which can beat him at a mile and a furlong. But there are none which can beat him at any longer distance. As a cup horse he is supreme and if primed for a short race probably would be on top at a mile. He can run fast, and as the saying on the turf goes, he can run all night. He is a reliable old fellow, too, and gives up every ounce of speed and stamina he possesses if it is necessary for him to win. He can carry heavy weight and run on any kind of a track, and he is just as good in the mud as he is in lightning fast going.

Leads All as Winner. He has won more cup races than all other horses in training combined and he is as sound as a bell and likely to win some more.

What Exterminator is as a cup horse Morvich is as a juvenile. This young California bred son of Runymede, which came East believed to be a selling plater, has done everything a great thoroughbred should do. He has started nine times under all sorts of conditions and each time led home his field in clever fashion. He has won more than \$65,000 during the season and he is likely to reach the \$100,000 mark before retired to winter quarters.

Morvich is a great colt, but he is not sound. He had bad knees. He looks as if he had knots on them. But they don't bother him either in his training or his races and they might be like Colin's famous Mouth-hock.

First Start in Selling Race. It was because of these bad knees that he was sold on three occasions for the proverbial song. A. B. Spreckles brought him East and started him in a selling race. Off of a week of 104 he galloped away from a high class field of young platers and came home galloping in a minute and a fraction. He wasn't bid up or bought out of that race, but immediately after it Max Hirsch bought him for \$4,500. He kept him a few days and sold him to Fred Burlew and Benjamin Block for \$7,500 and a percentage of his future winnings.

A month later, after he had won several races, Mr. Block brought him outright from Burlew for a price which brought his total cost up to \$22,000.

Morvich has won more than that for Mr. Block, but his owner hasn't profited much, for he gave away most of his winnings in the United States Hotel Stakes and the Hopeful to his trainer, Jockey and stable hands.

### Col. Ruppert Pays \$1,000 For Box Seat At Matty's Game

Col. Jacob Ruppert, president of the New York Yankees, paid \$1,000 for a box for the Christy Mathewson testimonial game which will be played between the Giants and the Boston Braves at the Polo Grounds on Sept. 30th.

"Matty always gave his best to the Giants," said the colonel at the Polo Grounds, "and his great pitching helped to stimulate interest in this city. He was a credit to the game, a gentleman on and off the ball field, and although he has passed out of the baseball picture, he is still an idol of the New York fans."

"I hope that there are as many at the Polo Grounds on Sept. 30th as were at the Yankees' double header last Sunday."

Sir Barton Sold. Sir Barton, formerly owned by J. K. Ross of Montreal, and one of the best known horses on Canadian and U.S. tracks, has been brought to Audley Farm, the old home of Nellie Parke Cutis, Winchester, Va., which R. R. Jones, Oklahoma oil magnate, has announced will be converted into one of the largest farms for breeding race horses in the country. Sir Barton will head the stud to be maintained at the farm.
