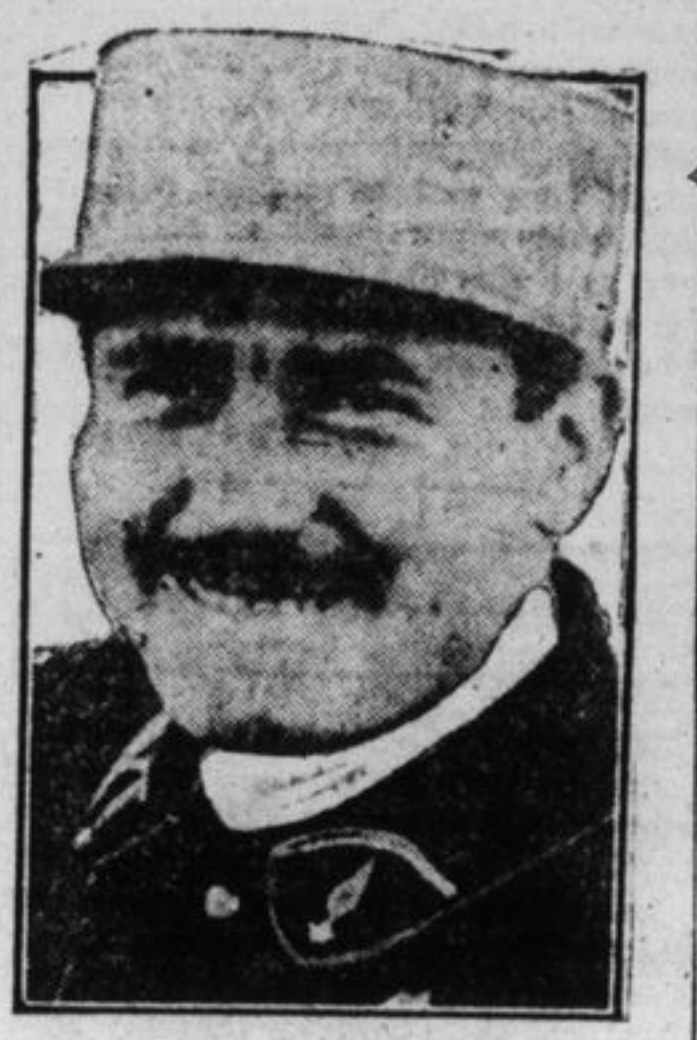
To Meet in Toronto.

NEW SCHOOL GEOGRAPHY.
Still Tells of the Kaiser on the German Throne.
There is much merriment among pupils of the public and high schools who have had to wait since the first of the month to obtain copies of what is known as the "School Geography," used to some extent in both institutions. They were told that the old supply was exhausted and that a new one was being gotten out. And now they have it. The book is embellished with a new map of the new Europe, but the reading matter still tells about Serbia and Montenegro and all the other ex-kingdoms, with the Kaiser firmly seated upon the throne of Germany—everything as it was in 1910 when the book was copyrighted. And the armistice is nearly three years in the distance. The explanation is simple. The book is really not a new geography. It is a reprint of the old one, with a map added. The department of education had to content itself with this because of the printers' strike. It has a new geography up its sleeve, or wherever it keeps such things, and this will be issued when printers permit.

NEW TEACHERS FOR C.I.
C. M. Arnott and P. Muir Appointed to Toronto Staff.
C. M. Arnott, undergraduate of Queen's University, and Peter Muir, B.A., of Queen's, have been appointed to the Toronto Board of Education to the staff of Riverdale Collegiate Institute. Mr. Arnott holds two years' honor classics at Toronto University, first-class honors in mathematics and physics at Queen's, high school assistant's certificate, and is a specialist in physical culture. His experience includes four years at the High School of Commerce and six years at Williamson Road public school, Kew Beach, whence he transfers to Riverdale. Mr. Muir holds first, second and third-class honors in science, high school assistant's certificate, and has completed examinations for science specialist. He has taught one year in Toronto public schools. He served overseas.

E. H. HALDANE DEAD.
Death in Ireland Reported to Sister in Cornwall.
Cornwall, Sept. 24.—Mrs. Cecil G. Payne has received a cable announcing the death of her brother, E. H. Haldane, which occurred at Dublin, Ireland, at the age of 29 years. Mr. Haldane was well-known here, having visited Mr. and Mrs. Payne during the time he was engaged in mining operations in the Porcupine district. In 1915 he left for home, joined the British navy and saw service at the Dardanelles. He was invalided home and later went to British North Borneo, where he remained until March last, after which he went to Egypt. While Mrs. Payne was visiting in Kingston last-week she received a postal card from her brother from Port Said, Egypt, saying he was leaving for London and would write as soon as he reached home.

A foreign office official says that the British government is dismayed by the Canadian banks' loan to China. He says that if the Chinese government chooses to repudiate the loan, the lenders have no recourse, as they are not supported by the British or Canadian governments.

Notary F. A. Labelle, Hull, Que., is being mentioned for the solicitor-generalship in the Meighen cabinet. Mr. Labelle, if he accepts the post, will run in Hull county against Dr. J. E. Fontaine.
