

Cornwall, Sept. 26 .- An accident attended with fatal results occurred at the General Hospital last night. when Laura Labelle, the eighteenyear-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Elzear Labelle, who live about two miles west of Lancaster, met instant death. Exactly how the accident happened will never be known, as
