GETTING UNDER WAY AGAIN IN THE LOCAL RUGBY WORLD

Teams Showing Up Well at Queen's and R.M.C.—Stadium Progressing and New Press Box to Be Built.

Things are all set for a big rugby season here this fall. The start will be on Saturday with the practice game between Queen's and R.M.C. and then Varsity and Parkdale follow in quick succession, the Toronto University team in the opening game of the intercollegiate and Parkdale in a special exhibition game the following Saturday.

Queen's are rapidly rounding into shape. George Awrey, the new director of athletics, who is personally looking after the rugby squad, stated on Monday afternoon, after the daily workout, that he was not by any means satisfied yet, but that matters generally in connection with the rugby squad were well. Every day valuable additions to the bunch come drifting in and George has them in uniform in short order. The squad will be swelled considerably when college opens and then an idea can be had of all the available material. From R.M.C. there is not much leaking out except that the boys are all working hard and that they intend to give Queen's the time of their young lives on Saturday next. The cadets are always in shape and they can give and take some hard knocks. Their speed is traditional and that back division that is being rounded out on Queen's lower campus will have to travel to keep up to them.

To the reporters and telegraphers comes the welcome news that one Kingston sport is going to be written in a decent press box. Mr. Awrey told representatives of the local papers on Monday that the new Queen's stadium is going to have a press box similar to the one in Varsity stadium at Toronto. It will be constructed high in the "bleachers" opposite the grand stand, will be entirely enclosed and will have movable windows in front. Twelve press and telegraph representatives may be accommodated inside.

LITTLE BITS

The two Morris brothers, with K.C.I. last year, are showing up well in Queen's squad this year. Fred is a little light, though speedy, for first team work but Benny may make a bid for a wing position on the first squad.

"Bill" Shaw twisted his ankle badly on Monday while practising. It was feared first that some of the bones were broken but examination showed that it was a sprain. It will keep him out of the game for a few days.

"Chiff" Gibson is back on the field again. He did good work with the seniors last season and is showing up well again.

"Johnny" Evans, the likely nomination for quarter, took the "first" squad Monday against the "second" and used some signals. He's full of snap again this year.

"Archie" Abernethy is back again to attend college. It is not known yet whether he will be out for rugby as his academic year is rather a heavy one. It would be too bad to lose him as he was a great wing man on last year's seniors.

Old "Smutter" Veale has come back from the sick list where he was nursing a badly bruised shoulder. He still lays them low by the ankles in the good old-fashioned way.

When "Joe" Breen walks on the field with his Parkdale Paddlers he will find a different Queen's rugby team to that which he played against last year with Varsity.

"Bill" Carroll, Queen's back two years ago, is trying out on the wing position and is surprisingly good at it.

"Paddy" Moran, veteran quarter of the old Williams-Elliott-Macdonell-Leckie days at Queen's was cut on the field Monday looking them over.

Two other visitors to the lower campus on Monday were those old-time wingleline scrappers "Dick" Sheehy of Varsity and "Ernie" Sitter of Queen's.
