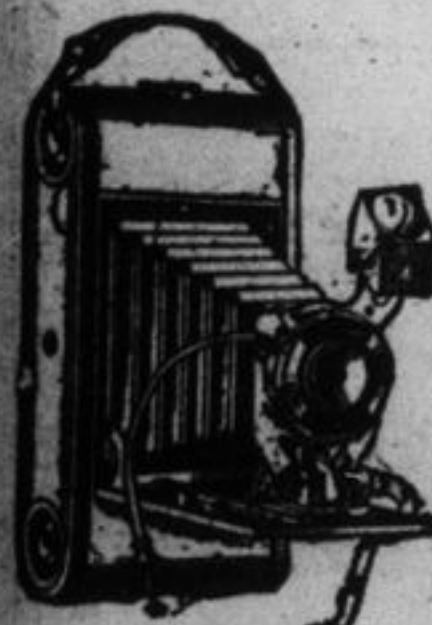

In the World of Sport

The Giant Revival

Sixteen years ago, through the impressive pitching of Mathewson, the Giants concluded one of the most impressive world series victories ever known. They shut out the Athletics in four out of five games, Matty pitching twenty-seven scoreless innings, backed up by championship support.

Since that brilliant melee the Giants' average in world series play has been singularly depressing, not to say superlatively sour. In four attempts against the Athletics, Red Sox and White Sox they were rolled back into the gravel ditch, marred and mangled, without a triumph.

In view of these facts, what chance is there now for a Giant revival?

The Record.

Here is the Giants' world series record:

- 1905 vs. Athletics, won four and lost one.
- 1911 vs. Athletics, won two and lost four.
- 1912 vs. Red Sox, won three and lost four.
- 1913 vs. Athletics, won one and lost four.
- 1915 vs. White Sox, won two and lost four.

This shows a total of twelve victories and seventeen defeats, not so lopsided as it might appear in view of the general results. But since the 1905 machine that carried Mathewson, McGinnity, Breenahan, Donlin, and other stars, the average has been a trifle soggy, with only eight victories against seventeen defeats for a mark of .333.

With good pitching, which the club has been getting of late, there is at least a fair chance for a throw-back to ancient days, for any ball club that can grace the field with Frisch, Bancroft, Kelly, Young and Burns—among others—is no rickety machine.

They are said to have offered Cleghorn over \$2,000 to jump to the Alberta League, providing the Ottawas would let him go. It's a big proviso, and, according to latest dope, the Senators won't let the Wally Reid of the league away.

World Series "Split."

This is the way in which world series money is divided:

- 15 per cent. of the gross receipts of all games is paid to the secretary-treasurer of the advisory council.
- 60 per cent. of the balance from the first five games goes into the players' pool and is divided:
- 75 per cent. to the winners in each league, 60 per cent. to the winners of the world series and 40 per cent. to the losers.
- 20 per cent. to the second and third highest teams in each league, 60 per cent. divided among the teams finishing third.

Balance of gross receipts divided equally between clubs, each club paying 50 per cent. into its league treasury, or 75 per cent. in case the eighth and ninth games of a series are played.

Golf Clubs Amalgamated.

Bay of Quinte Country Club will be proceeded with at once. This comes as a result of the Belleville Golf Club, Limited, voting in favor of amalgamation with the proposed country club. The latter has elected permanent directors, as follows: S. Robertson, S. R. Burrows, Jamieson Bone, R. D. Ponton, George K. Graham, J. S. McKeown, G. H. Gillespie, W. J. Hume and Henry Taylor.

The new golf course is three miles west of the city. The land is seventy acres in extent along the shore of the Bay of Quinte and will make an ideal nine-hole course.

The Golf Club.

The prospects for the formation of a golf club in Renfrew are exceedingly bright. Keen interest is being taken in the matter by quite a number, and the committee has already made considerable progress in the matter of looking over possible sites.

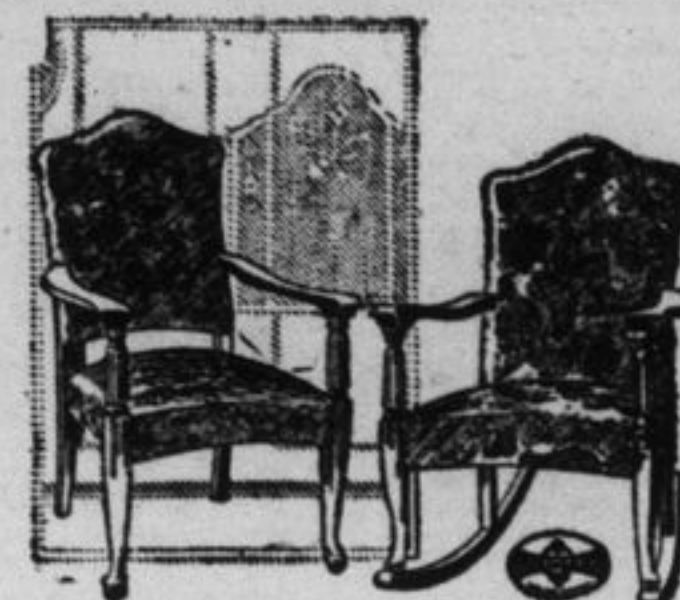
