THE HOME KITCHEN

Seven Ways To Serve The Extra Vegetable.

In most families potatoes, in s form or another, are as standerd. a dish as bread, and always accompany the meat dish. Generally there is an extra vegetable besides. is about this dish that I now w offer suggestions. Early fall brings plenty of fresh vegetables for choice and it is only the best

Curried Corn. Cut the corn very carefully from six ears—if the family is large ten ears may be required—and scrape down the ears with the back of the knife, but be careful not to scrape bits of the husk into the dish. Take a small can of tomatoes and add a sliced onion, a stalk of celery, half a pepper, chopped fine, a teaspoonsful of curry powder, a tablespoonful of sugar, salt, pepper and half a teaspoonful of ginger. Stew gently for twenty-five minutes. Meantime cut two slices of pickled pork in dice and fry them a delicate brown, then add them to the corn with a tablespoonful of the fat. Strain the tomato, then thicken very slightly with butter and flour mixed to a paste. Butter a deep baking dish, put in the

Dutch Potatoes. Boil and mush six good-sized potatoes. Season them with a big lump of butter, pepper, salt and two tablespoonfuls of hot cream. Spread the mixture is buttered, shallow baking dish and cover the top with a layer of well-seasoned, firm apple sauce. Dust the top with a tablespoonful of dry crumbs mixed with two tablespoonfuls of grated cheese. Put in the oven long enough to brown light-

Turnip Ramekins. Pare and grate one medium-sized yellow turnip and twee good-sized potatoes. Add two beaten eggs, two tablespoonfuls of soft butter, pepper, salt, a tablespoonful of sugar, threequarters of a cupful of crumbs and a heaping tablespoonful of very finely and stir through the corn. Bake for chopped nuts: Mix thoroughly, and fill buttered ramekins lightly with the mixture. Bake ten minutes, covered, then ten minutes uncovered, browning evenly. Garnish the top of each individual service dish with

Baked Tomatoes. Select large, firm, smooth tomatoes and hollow out the stem end, then set them on a buttered baking pan. Mix together a quarter of a cupful of finely minced cold boiled ham, a quarter of a cupful of crumbs, a beaten egg, a lump of soft butter, a quarter of a cupful of crumbs and a little sugar, and a little cream. Fill one tablespoonful of chopped pine the tomatoes, oil them over, and dust with grated cheese. Bake until


