BANK AT RIO DE JANEIRO.

The Canadian Bank of Commerce Is to Enter Field.

The Canadian Bank of Commerce is about to open an office in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, and add another important link to the long chain of branches of that institution.

The importance of Rio as the capital and metropolis of the largest country in South America is not fully realized in Canada. Its population exceeds that of Toronto and Montreal combined, being 1,200,000 and it is the seaport for the most densely settled part of the Republic.

Rio possesses a magnificent landlocked harbor, twenty miles long and five to ten mfles wide, the entrance of which is open to ships of the greatest draught. Deepwater quays have been constructed which permit mooring and loading direct of the largest vessels.
