Rev. Mr. Watts spoke in Convocation hall on Thursday evening on the "First Days of British Rule in Canada," taking the place of William Smith, of the Ottawa Historical Society, who was unable to be present. The lecturer was interesting and entertaining throughout. The speaker referred to the kindness of the British troops to the French inhabitants, after the capitulation of Quebec, and remarked that General Amherst ordered his men to treat the captured people fairly, and requested the French to reciprocate in this feeling. This friendliness became so developed, that a great deal of inter-marriage occurred, resulting in MacDonalds, McLeods, Ryans, and other old Scotch and Irish families in Quebec being unable today to speak even broken English in some cases. Shortly after the fall of Quebec the French governor remarked that the French people enjoyed greater privileges under British rule than formerly, as in the three courts established at Montreal, Three Rivers and Quebec, French judges were allowed to retain their place. The treaty of Paris, 1763, cemented this union between the two peoples, but problems are still in existence, showing the gap between the two races. After much discussion, mostly from the British settlers, the Quebec act, was put into force, giving the "Canadians" their own commercial laws and retaining the English criminal law, with mutual satisfaction to all. This was the final solution, at least as far as statement of the day could devise it, and has done much to relieve the internal strife, being just and generous to all. The sessions of the theological conference were brought to a close Friday morning by the final address of the chancellor's lectureship by Dr. E. F. Scott, who is recognized as one of the leading authorities on his subject in the world. This year's conference has been a splendid success, and many active ministers who attended expressed the hope that they would be able to be present again next year. The conference is really a refresher course for those ministers who are more or less isolated in their own parishes throughout the year, and it gives them a chance to obtain ideas and compare notes, which will be very helpful in their work.
