Keep Brood Cows In Winter as Cheaply as Possible.

During the winter the brood sows should be maintained as cheaply as possible, but at the same time they row a large number of healthy, well-grown pigs in the spring. Best on the sows of one-half or threefourths of a pound. To do this the grain feed must be limited, and diluted with some roughage, for unless the ration has sufficient bulk, the sows will become constipated and hungry, due to the undistended condition of the digestive tract. Legume

Either alfalfa, clover, soy-bean, or needed to balance the corn. Bright, leafy alfalfa hay gives the best results of any of these roughages. Alfalfa meal is simply the best grade of alfalfa hay chopped into a meal. Clover hay contains almost as much nourishment as alfalfa hay, and soybean hay, cut and cured when the ing and consequently does not have as high food value as soy-bean hay. Great care must be exercised in curing soy-bean and cowpea hay, for the stalks are very heavy and succulent and unless thoroughly dried Many in Brockville will hear with any roughage which is not bright, mold.
