BEATTY PAYS TRIBUTE TO CANADA IN THE WAR. Says Dominion's Patriotism is a Golden Page in Empire History.

Toronto, Nov. 11.—In a message from Admiral Beatty to Water J. Francis, president of the Engineering Alumni Association of the University of Toronto, expressing regret that he could not accept an invitation to visit Toronto in connection with his present visit to the United States, the famous admiral says:

"It would have been a pleasant duty to pay publicly a humble tribute to the wonderful work of Canadians ashore and afloat during the Great War, and to testify to the affectionate admiration with which they are regarded in the Old Country. The patriotism and devotion of the sons of Canada have added a golden page to the history of the Empire."

Hon. W. S. Fielding, Finance Minister in Laurier Government, says: "By their fruits the public shall know the policies of the two political parties. The Liberals took office at a time of depression in 1896. Under their tariff policy, which was not the National Policy, as it was not claimed by Conservatives, but a reformed and (except as to a few luxuries) a reduced tariff, the country prospered as never before. The period from 1897 to 1911, was one of the full dinner pail to the workingman. Workmen who read the hysterical newspaper advertisements and street posters of the Government party will remember that, substantially the same methods were employed by the same party in 1896. The Liberal party has given the country abundant proof of the moderation and wisdom with which it treats tariff questions and there is no reason to suppose that if again placed in power it will not, as before, frame its economic policy with due regard to the needs of all classes of the Canadian people."
