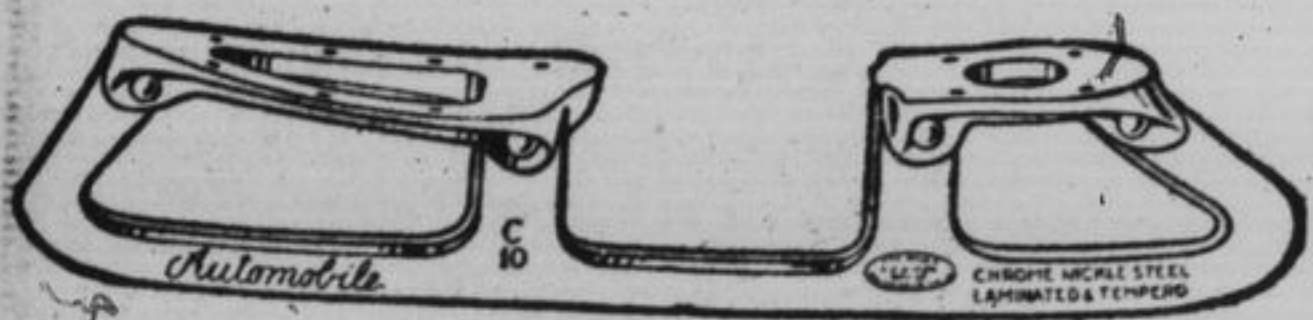

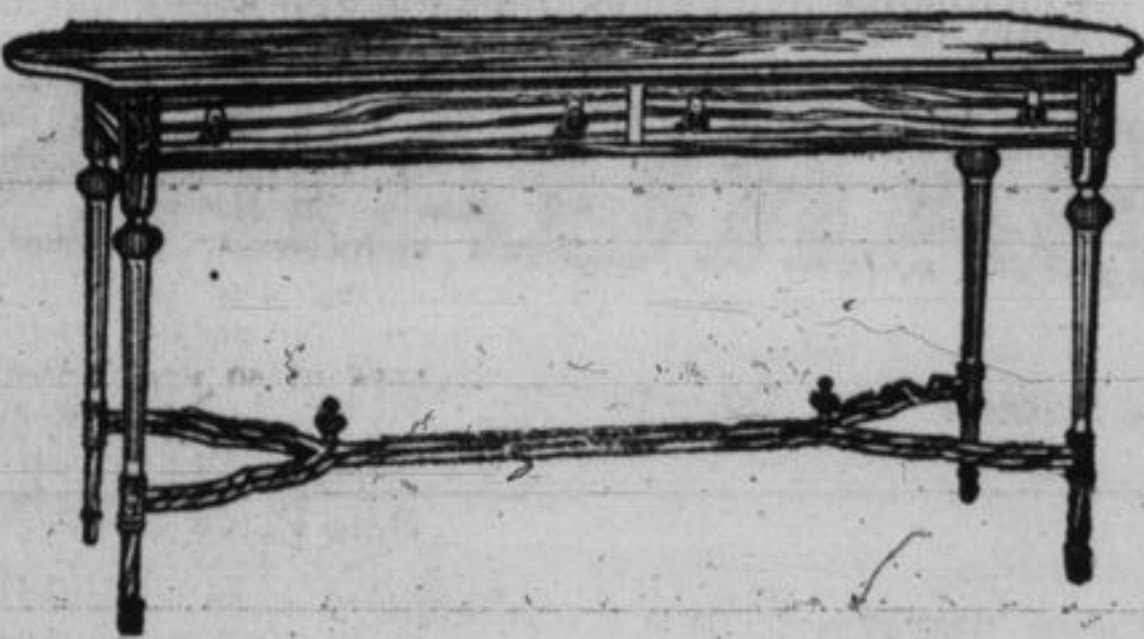

Eddie is taking it easy this fall. When not at home in Landdowne, Pa., he is attending football games, for he was formerly a star quarterback at Columbia, and still is a fan. He also is looking after his business interests.

TEN KILLED IN UNITED STATES FOOTBALL SEASON

Football claimed ten victims during the 1921 season, which closed with Thanksgiving Day games.

The death list was three less than 1920, and three above the toll of two years ago. Ten lives were lost as the result of games in 1918, twelve in 1917, eighteen in 1916, and fifteen in 1915.

As in former years, the majority of youths killed were members of high school teams.

With one exception, none of the victims were more than 20 years old.

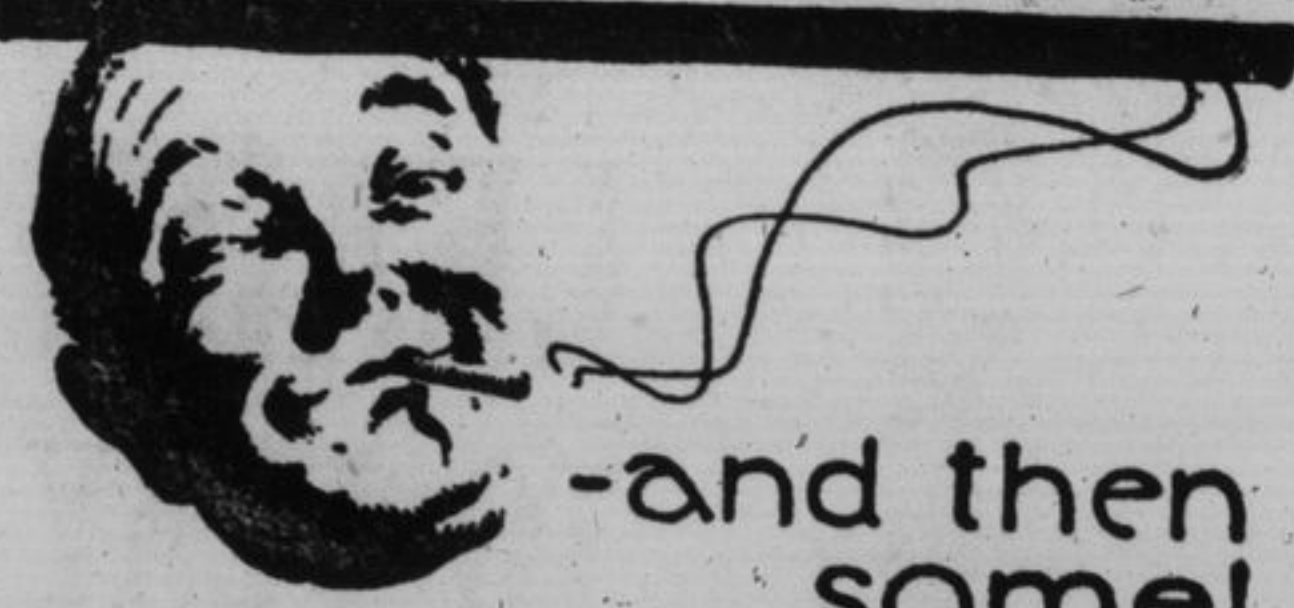

Wills received only \$5,000 for his end, as he had no idea boxing was so popular in Havana, and he neglected to have a percentage clause inserted in his contract.
