Mr. Campbell supports the tariff policy of the Liberal leader, as outlined in Kingston, on Wednesday evening, when Mr. King said: "Do you know how much is to be raised in taxes this year?" he queried. "Just \$560,000,000, without paying off one cent on the public debt. What is the sense then of any person declaring for free trade? And I say on behalf of the Liberal party that I do not stand for free trade because we feel that to raise this revenue it must be done by other means than direct taxation.
