Lieut. McDonnell Comes Back.

Kingston, Ont., Dec. 3.—(To the Editor): Evidently some people are impatient. They will not answer clear cut arguments indicating the failure of soldier civil re-establishment but resort to personalities.

But for Major "Billy" Nickle I make no allowances and brand his statements, if quoted properly in the Standard of Nov. 20th, as a very serious tampering with the truth and an indecent attempt on his part to make election capital out of reports that are not true.

I come from good old Liberal stock and am a relative of a recent Liberal premier who has not so long since passed to his reward.

Further, in my little address on re-establishment the other night I made no remarks derogatory to the character of Dr. Ross.

Now to go on with more personal history which I did not desire brought into this campaign but which am forced to bring in order to convince Major Billie and others of his ilk that I have made similar sacrifices and fought similar battles previously in the interest of soldier civil re-establishment when there was no election issue at stake.

In the fall of 1917 I began duties with the department of D.S.C.R. Six months later I resigned as a protest against local conditions, which were inefficiently administered and unjust to the soldier.

Will Major Billie or the Standard if they be fair insist that I did this voluntary resignation because I was a sore-head? I think they will have to give the credit of having done it for the cause of re-establishment.

But it is necessary, I suppose, to give all the personal facts in my dealings with the department of soldiers' re-establishment in order to make my stand of the present time clear.

Did I play fair? On the 4th of November I wrote Meighen and Mr. Manion demanding an investigation. Acknowledgments were received after considerable delay.

I reiterate my arguments of the other night. Re-establishment has failed, failed dismally through poor administration, and I would for verification of some of its injustices, as Major Billie will not take the word of a Liberal, refer him to his Uncle Hughie, who as one of three sat on every case that was ever granted training in this district except in the last three months of my tenure of office.

Major Billie, as a rising young legal light, I would advise you to be sure of your facts, square up to the argument and if you fall before it do not camouflage your fall by personal attacks on your opponent, and do not let partisanship entirely blind you to the failure of re-establishment for the returned men under this government.
