Renfrew's Assessment.

The population of Renfrew is 5,031 divided among the different wards as follows: South ward, 1,743; Centre ward, 1,605; North ward, 1,681. The increase of population for the year was 122 in the South ward, 175 in the Centre while the North ward shows a decrease of two. The assessment is \$4,338,268, an increase of \$107,924.

Medal for Heroism.

Christmas, falling on Sunday, Monday, Dec. 26th will be the public holiday associated with the festival. There is a statute determining that when Christmas Day or New Year's Day happened on a Sunday, the following Monday should be observed as a legal holiday and advantage thereof given to employees. This is the first time since 1910.

Smith's Falls is Brighter.

The Malleable Castings company, Smith's Falls, reopened a part of their plant on Thursday. Fifty men will be taken on as a start. The municipal stone quarry will be reopened within a few days, and stone will be taken out for use in connection with the Smith's Falls section of the Kingston-Ottawa provincial highway.

Noted Jurist Passes Beyond.

Judge Wunauaker, Bethany, Missouri, a native of Prince Edward county, passed away recently. He was a first cousin of Byron Way, Belleville. He lived in Canada until he was nineteen years of age, and received his literary training in the public schools and the Collegiate Institute of Belleville, Ont. He came to the United States in 1869, his parents settling in Missouri, and entered the University of Michigan, graduating with the degree of LL.B.

Returning to Campbellford.

Many will be glad to hear of the return of Col. J. A. Macoun, M.P., to Campbellford, after nearly six years' absence overseas. He and Mrs. Macoun left home in the spring of 1915, and the colonel has been on duty ever since, having served in hospitals in France during the war, and since that in England. The colonel looks hale and hearty. Mrs. Macoun expects to arrive in Campbellford shortly and they will occupy their residence on Frank street.

Was Born in Kingston.

Archibald Robert Rutherford, who for over twenty years had been in the service of the C.P.R. Company, died at Montreal. He had been employed in the capacity of railway conductor for the last twelve years. Mr. Rutherford, who was sixty years of age, was born in Kingston and resided nearly all his life in Ontario. He lived in Smith's Falls for a number of years.
