ARE TALKING NOW OF BRITISH ELECTIONS

Chronicle Says It is All Fudge—No Cogent Reasons For It.

London, Dec. 5.—The Pall Mall Gazette declares that a general election will take place in February, the prime minister wishing to consult the electorate on the Irish problem in the event of a breakdown in the negotiations, and also, it is suggested, in order to receive a mandate from the nation on the subjects under discussion at the Washington conference.

The Daily Chronicle's political correspondent asserts, however, that Lloyd George has formed no such intention. There is still a possibility, says the correspondent, that an Irish settlement may result from the present negotiations, and even if the negotiations completely broke down there would be no cogent reasons against a general election as any that could be advanced in favor of one.

Fire Losses in Canada. Toronto, Dec. 5.—Fire losses in Canada during the week ended November 30th are estimated by the Monetary Times at \$258,500, compared with \$334,000 the previous week.

Crowe Appointed to Senatorship. Ottawa, Dec. 5.—S. J. Crowe, Vancouver, and member for the constituency of Barrard in the last parliament, has been appointed to the senate.

McColl seems to have picked up the rifle to examine it, and in some unexplained manner the cartridge was discharged, the bullet entering his temple and killing him instantly.
