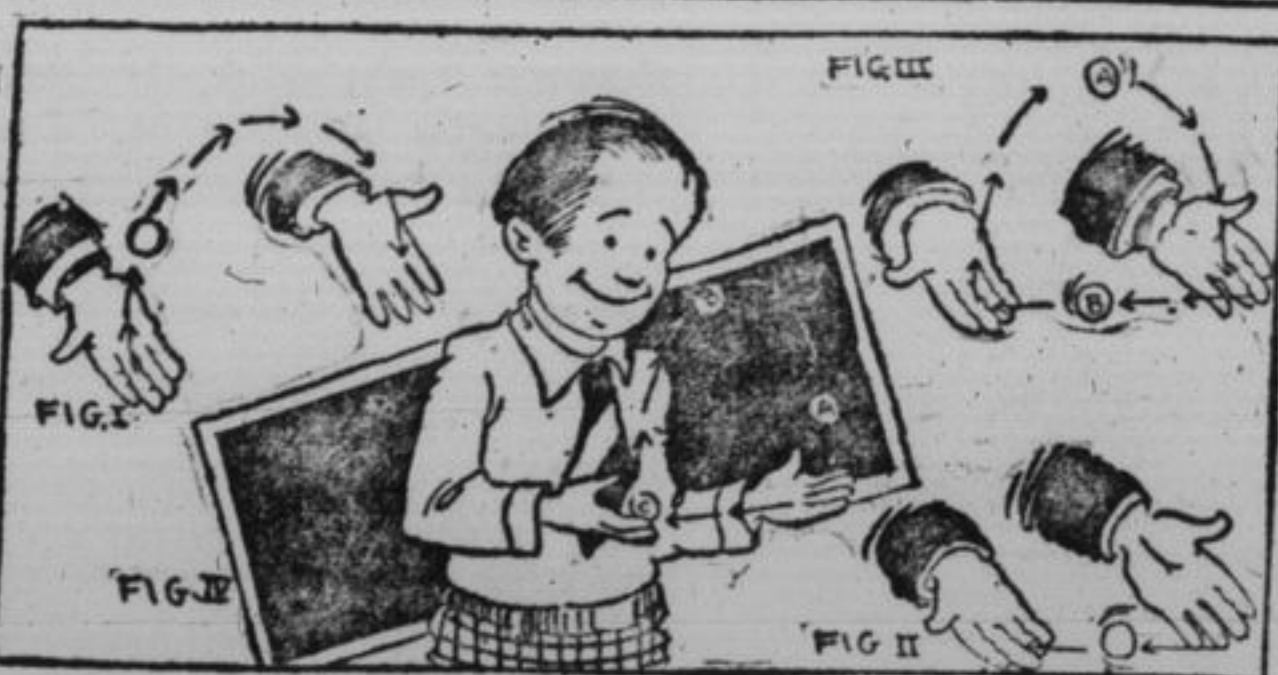


FIGURE 1. This shows merely of passing the ball from one hand to the other in a straight, horizontal path.

Combine Two Passes. Then, combine the arc pass and the horizontal pass. This combination makes the single wheel.

Start by passing one ball back and forth from one hand to the other, making it travel in an arc about a foot and a half high.

Three Balls. And now for the third ball. I warn you, this is difficult. The three-ball wheel takes practice.

Try to keep the balls always the same distance apart. Throw them about three feet into the air.
