

A SERIOUS MATTER.

The Closing of the Mowat Poll Is Much Discussed.

When questioned on the subject of the Mowat Hospital poll, a prominent lawyer stated: "A number of irregularities have been brought to my attention and it seems to me that the departure from the instructions regarding the opening and closing of polls as contained in the election act is a serious matter. The poll was to open at 8 a.m. and remain open until 6 p.m. The deputy returning officer was given no discretion at all. and the closing of the poll two or three hours ahead of time, the opening of the ballot box and permitting the result to be published, was a serious matter, particularly-in a close fight like that of Tuesday, and might be regarded by a judge as sufficient cause to declare no election."
