Lowest Level in Years.

An Odd Duck.

When Capt. Tullock of the steamer Clinton was coming down the lakes on his last trip previous to putting his vessel in the dry dock at Cornwall for the winter, and when between the Main Ducks and Nine Mile Point, he saw a strange object on the boat, which turned out to be a duck of a kind unfamiliar to him. This was at night and the bird seemed to be bewildered and was easily caught and put in the bath tub, where it made itself quite at home. When the Clinton got to Cornwall the strange duck was referred to the bird expert of the Freeholder, who identified it as a male specimen of the long-tailed duck or old wife, locally known as Caween or Old Squaw. It is mostly a sea duck, and on the eastern coast of the United States is called South. Southernly, from the resemblance of its cry to those words.

Provisional Cavalry School.

The provisional school of cavalry, being conducted at the armories for the benefit of the 4th Hussars, is now on its fourth week and has been progressing very nicely since inauguration. Between ten and twelve of the members of the regiment are attending this course and have found

the work both interesting and instructive, either as a refresher, or as entirely new work, as many of those now with the regiment are not familiar with this branch of the service, having served overseas with the artillery or infantry.

Although two or three names have been already struck off the list, as unfit to carry on with this unit, through lack of interest or poor attendance, several have joined the course later and have shown themselves most enthusiastic. Apparently some of the would-be cavalrymen have the idea that if they already know enough to pass the examinations at the end of the course, they are good enough for the 4th Hussars, but the authorities in charge, are more concerned with the interest shown in the course and the regiment than with the results of the final tests.

HAD TWO HUSBANDS UNDER ONE ROOF

Extraordinary Case of Bigamy Is Aired in Windsor Court.

Windsor, Dec. 7.—"One of the most extraordinary cases I have ever heard of," Judge Gundy remarked in Windsor police court yesterday, when disposing of the case against Mrs. Pearl Cummings, 963 Campbell Avenue, charged with bigamy. In spite of the fact that she had two husbands, both were living with her under the same roof. Family affairs went on harmoniously, they informed the court.

Police said that the triangular experiment went long perfectly for a year until Saturday night, when Cummings, husband No. 1, quarrelled with George McDonald, husband No. 2, while under the influence of liquor.

In view of the circumstances, Judge Gundy allowed the woman to go on suspended sentence. The bigamy charge against McDonald was not pressed.

May Have Three Years' Delay.

Paris Dec. 7.—Germany will probably be granted a three-years' delay in her cash indemnity payments, the Associated Press is informed from the most reliable source. Negotiations are now going on between the reparations officials of France and Great Britain, and the responsible officials of both countries virtually agree that Germany must be given a breathing spell. All that remains to be done is to work out a scheme acceptable to both countries.
