FOUR HANDITS MAKE HAUL OF \$30,000 Greenville, Ills., Dec. 12.—Four handits entered Panama near here to-day, robbed the Bank of Panama of about thirty thousand dollars, held up seven men in a poolroom next door, wounded a motorist, who pursued them, and escaped.

TWO HUMANE MEDALS TO BE PRESENTED By Lord Byng to Stuart Patterson and "Jack" Gilbert, Kingston. Two Royal Canadian Humane Society bronze medals are to be presented to Kingston young men by the governor-general at Queen's convocation proceedings on Wednesday evening. One is for Stuart Patterson, who last September showed conspicuous bravery by carrying Police Constable James Cotter to safety after the latter was shot by bandits in Glenburnie. The other is for "Jack" Gilbert, son of John Gilbert, Centre street, who went out on floating ice near the King street breakwater last March and saved Irene Beck from drowning.

MAKING GOOD PROGRESS. At the Queen's Rink—Flooding Expected on Thursday. The men employed in building the new rink at Queen's University are taking every advantage of the mild weather to rush the work along. On Monday, masons were pushing the work on the east wall. It was expected that the plaster will all be on by Tuesday noon at the very latest. It is the intention of the Athletic Board of Control to have two more coats of plaster put on next Spring.

On Sunday, hundreds of citizens visited the new building. When the rink is completed, between two and three hundred thousand feet of lumber will have been used. In the roof one hundred thousand feet was required. It will have required twenty carloads of lumber to erect the building. Five carloads will be used in the seats.

It was stated on Monday morning that providing the weather is cold and the ground is levelled, the work of flooding will commence on Thursday.

The ice makers are hoping that the mild weather will continue for a couple of days, as they will be able to make a good bed for the ice without drawing chinders.

India Cannot Expect Complete Independence Now London, Dec. 12.—A despatch from Lucknow, India, stated that the acceptance of Irish Home Rule by the Empire by Ireland has cut the ground from under the feet of the advocates of independence for India, since the extremists have largely taken Ireland for their model.

NORTH OXFORD CAMPAIGN. The Contest for the Provincial Seat Has Started. Woodstock, Dec. 12.—The provincial campaign in North Oxford started off this morning and promises to be an interesting fight. Wellington Hay, temporary leader of the Liberals, is in the riding, and Premier Dryden and member of his cabinet, are expected tomorrow. The candidates are W. W. Day, Liberal, D. N. Ross, U.F.O., and Homer Neely, Independent.

Donates Frontenac Hockey Cup. It was announced on Monday morning that W. S. Reed, U.F.O. member-elect for Frontenac, had decided to donate a silver hockey trophy to be competed for by teams from the county. For some years the trophy from the county has competed for the Dr. J. W. Edwards' trophy. Last winter after some very exciting games, the Edwards' trophy was handed over to the Verona hockey club.

Now that the new Frontenac member has agreed to donate a trophy, the followers of the game think that a board of trustees should be chosen who will have control of the league. The men feel that great care should be taken in the selection of the trustees, who should be men who understand hockey from A to Z.
