RADICAL CHANGE IN TENNIS RULES

England's Controlling Body to Compel Titleholder to Play Through.

The controlling body of lawn tennis in England has decided to take a radical step and so amend the rules for the All-England championship tournament at Wimbledon that after next year the titleholder must play through instead of stand out until the challenge round, which has been the practice for years.

This decision conforms with the rule now in force in the United States, where the title-holder has had to play through for two or three years. Furthermore, William T. Tilden, who won the All-England championship here last June and carried it to the United States for the second year in succession, has been advised by letter that he will have the option of playing through or standing out at the tournament next year if he comes back to defend his title.

As Tilden has gone on record in expressing the opinion that title-holders should play through, as a fairer method of competition, it is quite possible that he will not stand out next season.

Puckeringings.

Jackie McDonald, formerly of the Quebec Bulldogs hockey team, who was expected to join the ranks of the champion Ottawa Senators this winter, has accepted terms to play with the Saskatoon team.

Dr. Eddie Nagie, the former Ottawa College player, has signed to play professional hockey with the Saskatoon Crescents. It is reported that "Babe" Donnelly, of the Canadian Soo, is dickering with the Crescents.

Dick Irvine and Spunk Sparrow, former amateurs of the Saskatchewan Senior Amateur Hockey League, have signed up with the Regina Capitals and will shortly appear in the Western Canadian professional circuit.

BOHEMIAN HEAVYWEIGHT IN LATEST RIVAL

Another European rival for Jack Dempsey's world's heavyweight championship title probably will visit America early in the new year. The latest boxer of the old world to impress Europe with his qualifications as a title-contender is Frank Rose, a Bohemian heavyweight.

Ottokar Bartik, his manager, visited Tex Rickard in Madison Square Garden armed with clippings in foreign language which he said extolled Rose's ability and pictures which disclosed a muscular, obviously strong individual. According to Bartik, Rose has engaged in 100 ring battles over Central Europe, and has yet to experience the sensation of being knocked off his feet. The Bohemian is 28 years old, weighs about 165 pounds and stands about 5 feet 11 inches. His right name is Ruzicka.

In a recent demonstration before a gathering of Bohemian doctors, Rose, according to Bartik, stood perfectly still while a rival of about his own size delivered 84 blows in the region of the heart. When the rival tired Rose began punching, and after eight blows felled his opponent.

International Curling.

At Utica, N.Y., curlers representing Canada and the United States will meet in competition for the Gordon International medal on February 4th, according to an announcement by W. R. Clark, of the Grand National Curling Club of America.
