

Tire-Chain "Tips"

Overtight Chains Work Havoc With Tire Treads EVER, ON ANY CONSIDERATION, adjust a chain so tightly that it is not perfectly free on the tire and able to creep around it. thus distributing the wear due to cross-chain action over the entire L tread, instead of concentrating this at definite points on the rubber, to their serious detriment. The adjustment can be made tightly enough by drawing the side chains up by hand, but if this is done with the aid of tools, the chain will be likely to hug the tire and fall to creep around it as it should. Different makes of tires of the same nominal size vary enough in their dimensions so to make a decided difference in the chain length required and, if it happens that a casing of especially liberal "oversize" has been put on, since chains have been in use, it may be found that the side-chains will not book in place. This difficulty can be overcome by adding a makeshift link, twisted up from telegraph wire to each side chain, which will receive the book. A piece of telegraph wire is a handy thing to have in the tool box, as it can be used to replace a broken link in a side chain and keep the chain in service. The little soft steel links, known as emergency chain menders are very handy articles, as by their use cross-chains can be repaired very readily, on the road, with an ordinary pair of pilers. High Test Gasoline

It Is Expensive And Scarce, But It Burns Completely And Smoothly

N MANY OF THE LARGER CITIES, there is obtainable a grade of gasoline, which contains a considerably larger proportion of readily vaporizable constituents than does the ordinary article and the use of which results in much prompter attainment of full engine power, easier starting, increased mileage and lessened lubrication difficulties. This high grade fuel costs more than the common article, can be secured only by taking some pains and the supply of it is too limited to make proper any suggestion as to its general use, but nevertheless the motorist who can secure it readily and who is willing to pay the price, will find in its use a remedy for most of the troubles peculiar to cold weather engine operation. Motorists who keep their cars in very cold garages and to whom a quick "driveaway" is of importance and those who own old cars with instafficient provisions for intake heating may well consider securing a supply of such fuel for winter use, for there is no doubt that, in addition to the better starting and operative results which its use brings about, there is a substantial decrease in engine wear and tear to be credited to its employment, which goes far to offset its higher per gallon cost. It is of interest to recall that this high test gasoline is, practically speaking, the ordinary gasoline of ten years ago. done to avoid such danger?

Answer: If the work is done preperly, there should be no danger from scoring, in case the engine has plenty of good ell and you drive slowly, as any engine should be driven, the pistons of which have not been fully worn in. 
