Charles Edward Douglas, curate St. Luke's, Camberwell, alleges that Mr. Major did "openly teach doctrine concerning the resurrection which is contrary to the Christian religion as set forth in the book of mmon prayer and in holy scripture where the resurrection of the body is taught explicitly and is a vital siement in the general theological and philosophical system." Mr. Major is also accused of "importing the teach-ing of a heathen mystic (Gautama) nto the Christian religion which
