QUEEN'S ARTS' DINNER ON WEDNESDAY EVENING

Sir John Willison and Prof. E. A. Dale, Toronto, Were Speakers.

As one of the finest, will be remembered the annual dinner of the arts society of Queen's held in Grant hall Wednesday evening. Sir John Willison who was one of the principal speakers of the evening, in replying to the toast of "Canada and the Empire" spoke optimistically of the future of Canada, and stated that despite the big problems confronting the people yet he thought the reserve of patriotism would manifest itself and carry Canada through. He appealed to the students for a more sympathetic appreciation of the sacrifice the men who act in the legislatures of the country make and stated that it was their duty to take a keen interest in politics for the governments of Canada were up against "man-sized" jobs that called for the co-operation of all.

At 7.30 o'clock the members of the society who numbered about three hundred and their guests, who included the professors of the faculty, entered the hall which was prettily decorated with evergreens on the platform. Deputy cheer leader D. MacInnes by his antics managed to keep the faculty and the year yells in prominence.

Following the excellent dinner, served by Reid and Hambrook, caterers, the time being livened by songs, yells and music by Treener's orchestra, J. B. Runnings, president of the arts society, who acted as toastmaster, proposed the toast of "The King," which was observed by the singing of the national anthem.

Prof. MacClement was then called on to propose the toast of "Canada and the Empire," which he ably did, briefly remarking that Canada was a country which offered every opportunity for education and freedom in every respect.

Sir John Willison, who was called on to respond to the toast, spoke of his attachment to Queen's and while he might have been an absentee member he was always loyal to her. He briefly spoke of the government commission which had inspected the colleges in Ontario, and expressed the hope of all the recommendations of that commission might be met by the government, which, he stated, was kept engaged in maintaining the Hydro commission in funds.

Sir John remarked that Canada had been through a great ordeal in helping to make the world safe for democracy, and many changes had taken place politically. He believed that the two-party system would still prove to be the best for the country and claimed that with three or four parties in the government it would be found still more difficult to govern than it had been with the two-party system.

Referring to the position of men in public life, the speaker stated that democracy was a hard taskmaster and a shabby dealer, and whilst most men who enter public life would be richer if they had

Efficient Housekeeping

A Delicious Home Supper. If "the same old dishes" have become tiresome to the family, try the following unusual little supper:
Cheese-Spaghetti Croquettes
Quick Raisin Bread
Coffee
Apricot Trifle.

Cheese - Spaghetti Croquettes: Break the spaghetti and cook it in quickly boiling salted water till tender. Then drain and add to it 1-4 pound of grated cheese, 1 tablespoon of melted butter and 1 teaspoon of grated onion or onion juice. (If desired, 1-2 teaspoon of curry powder may also be added.) Measure this spaghetti by cups, and for every two cups of it add 1 cup of very thick tomato sauce and heat all over hot water. When the cheese is melted, remove the pan from the fire, stir in a beaten egg, and turn out onto a platter to cool. Mold, when chilled, into croquettes. Dip these croquettes into raw egg, then into bread crumbs, and place them in a frying basket. Lower them into deep, hot fat and when a rich brown, drain on crumpled brown paper for a second or two before serving.

Quick Raisin Bread: Two eggs, 1 cup of granulated sugar, 2 cups of sweet milk, 1 cup of seedless raisins, 4 cups of bread flour, 4 teaspoons of baking powder and 1-2 teaspoon of salt. Sift the dry ingredients together and add the well beaten eggs and the milk; last add the raisins, shape into two loaves, let stand for 20 minutes, then bake in a moderate oven for 35 minutes (possibly a little longer). Chopped walnuts may be substituted for the raisins, if desired.

Apricot Trifle: Soak 1-2 pound of washed dried apricots overnight in cold water, and in the morning stew them slowly until tender. Sweeten to taste. Then press the cooked fruit through a sieve or a potato ricer.
