Cutting Ice.
The annual ice harvest has begun at Cape Vincent, where certified ice is being cut for the passenger service of the St. Lawrence and Ontario divisions of the New York Central line. Simultaneously a great crop of ice is being taken for the refrigerators and cold storage plant of the Booth Fisheries, Cape Vincent station. Ice in the main channel of the St. Lawrence river ranges from 12 to 14 inches. Harbor ice, where the freezing has been protected by the breakwater, runs around 15 to 16 inches in thickness.

Public Rest Ground.
